## Weekend of January 29-30 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary time

#### Monday, January 31<sup>st</sup>

Today we celebrate The Memorial of Saint John Bosco, priest. John Bosco was ordained to the priesthood in Turin, Italy. He founded The Oratory of St Francis de Sales, a school for boys. His whole priesthood was devoted to the cause of education. He founded the Society of St Francis de Sales (Salesians) to carry on his system of education around the world. He is known as a "teacher and father to the young." St John reminds us of the value of education. He is a reminder to us that as adults, we need to love the youth among us and assure that they grow in both spiritual and practical learning. Let us pray today for all parents (primary educators of their children) and teachers that they may remain faithful in their educational duties.

#### Tuesday, February 1st

In today's first reading, we hear about the death of Absalom, King David's son. He was the leader of a revolt against his father. Yet, when David hears he is dead, he proclaims, "My son Absalom! My son, my son Absalom! If only I had died instead of you, Absalom, my son, my son!" David's love for his son never ended, even though Absalom sinned against him. This is a good reflection point for all of us. Love should always victor over anger and resentment. Perhaps this was also the thought process that led God to send his own Son to die in our place!

### Wednesday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>

Today is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It is a celebration of Jesus being presented to God and the people in the temple. This event has always been seen as the fulfillment of today's first reading which proclaims: "And suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek." The people of Israel had been waiting for a long time for the coming of the Messiah. The Presentation proclaimed that the Messiah was now here! Our God has also come to the temples of our hearts and our homes, and our churches, really to everywhere in our world. Let us go to this God who has come to be with us. Let us thank him and rely on His love and strength in our lives.

### Thursday, February 3rd

Today we celebrate The Optional Memorial of Saint Blase, bishop and martyr. St Blasé is remembered as a man who worked miracles of healing in the lives of his people. He is especially remembered for curing a young boy who had a fish bone stuck in his throat. Because of this, he is looked upon as the patron saint for all those suffering from diseases of the throat. On this day, the church offers us the Blessing of Throats in his memory. Let us pray today, asking God to deliver us from all ailments (physical and spiritual) of our throats. May we be loud in proclaiming God's praises with our mouths!

### Friday, February 4<sup>th</sup>

Our first reading today consists of praises for King David. He is remembered as God's shepherd over the people. He is remembered for his military battles, for his improvements made to the liturgical life of Israel, for his love of God, and even for his sinfulness from which he was always quick to repent. David, though far from perfect, was a man who always sought to grow closer to God. He is a wonderful person for us to imitate in this regard. Let us always turn from our sins to find the God who always loves us and welcomes us back.

## Saturday, February 5<sup>th</sup>

Today is the Memorial of Saint Agatha, virgin and martyr. We know practically nothing about the historical life of Agatha, except that she was martyred in the year 250. But, throughout the centuries, she has been praised for her virginity and her martyrdom. She was a woman wholly devoted to Christ. There was no one more precious to her in her life. She loved him so much that she was willing to die rather than offend him. Agatha stands in front of us today as a model of dedication to Christ. We too are called to live for Him and Him alone.





# Dear Padre,

## There are so many preachers urging us to "reform our lives." Most of this preaching centers on asking forgiveness for personal sins. Isn't there more involved?

**C**onsider that the reform more Christians should be focusing on is the social reform that fosters equality among human beings.

A central conviction of all Jesus' followers is that every person of whatever race, gender, class, nationality, or any other distinction is fundamentally equal in dignity to every other person. That is why we vigorously support the unborn, the disabled, the mentally challenged, the poor, and the elderly. Every



human is a creation of God, created in God's image. No one is better or more worthy than another.

This was certainly a key conviction of the Second Vatican Council: "With respect to the fundamental rights of human persons, every type of discrimination, whether social

or cultural, whether based on sex, race, color, social condition, language or religion is to be overcome and eradicated as contrary to God's intent" (Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World [*Gaudium et Spes*], 29).

If you wish to truly reform yourself, make a commitment to overcome discrimination on all levels, which is so obvious in our country's division between rich and poor. Get involved with social causes that help the poor, the unborn, the oppressed, and the elderly. Become a beacon of hope this new year. *Fr. Paul J. Coury, CSsR*
