# Weekend of January 14-15 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



**Welcome:** The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



Last week we looked at Faith as an intellectual assent to God's revelation of himself as handed on by the Church. Today, we will look at another level of what we call Faith. We will turn now to our emotional response to the self-revealing God.

It is out of love that God has revealed himself to us. His desire is that we come to know him and that we come to love him in return. Based on all the Church teaches us about God, and based upon our own experiences of being blessed by God, we can come to a deep belief that we are loved by him. In this sense, Faith is an unshakeable knowledge that I am loved by God. Such a belief should in turn lead us to love God! Faith reaches its highest level in this personal response to revelation. It is this personal response of our spirit to God's revelation that is most often referred to as the Virtue of Faith. It involves not only knowing "about" God, but having a personal loving relationship with him because of what we know about him!

#### Arizona Income Tax Credits.

Donations to CTSO (The Catholic Tuition Support Organization) should be used as tax credits on your Arizona State income tax. If you owe, for example, \$1000 to the State you can redirect that \$1000 to a child whose sponsors are registered members of the Our Lady of the Desert Church and who attend a catholic school in the diocese of Tucson. This will not cost you a dollar. It is a tax credit, not a tax deduction. This year the maximum deduction is \$2,483 for couples and \$1,243 for singles. You do not have to wait until April 15 so that you know how much money you owe to the state. You may estimate the amount based on last year's return. If you donate too much, you merely roll it over for next year's tax. But do not do this several years in a row so that you build up a big balance. If you donate now, then CTSO will send you a letter that you or your accountant can use to fill in the correct amounts on your 2022 Arizona tax forms 323 and 348. Please use code 1699 when completing the form. This scholarship fund is administered by the Knights of Columbus Council 15704 of Our Lady of the Desert Church. **Catholic Community Services** - Free Assistance with Tax Issues Do you need help with an issue with the Internal Revenue Service or the Arizona Department of Revenue? Free help is available through Catholic Community Services Low Income Tax Clinic (LITC) for eligible taxpayers who are dealing with tax issues. Whether you have received a letter from the IRS, or the Arizona Department of Revenue, have an unresolved tax issue, or have any other tax problem - Catholic Community Services is here to help you. The tax clinic will start on January 30th and run to April 15th and will be open every Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 2 pm to 6 pm, and on Saturdays from 9 am to 1 pm at the Pio Decimo Center, located at 848 S 7th Avenue, Tucson, Arizona 85701. 

Or will we be this people of faith who believe that even in the midst of pain and hardships and death and tragedy, that God is very much still present within us and around us? Do we trust that we can go through agony and rise to the Resurrection?



## **Dear Padre**,

#### I am African American. When I go to church, I feel disconnected from the rest of my life. How does the Church fit with my culture?

Church documents lift up different cultures as treasures to be preserved and incorporated into the life of the Church. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches, "[The gospel] must be proclaimed, celebrated, and lived in all cultures in such a way that they themselves are not abolished by it, but redeemed and fulfilled: It is with and through their own human culture, assumed and transfigured by Christ, that the multitude of God's children has access to the Father, in order to glorify him in the one Spirit" (CCC 1204).



Many think "catholic" means homogenous, that the Mass should be exactly the same everywhere. On the contrary, it is "catholic" because it takes in everything. It is, or at least it should be, a cross-cultural experience, for we all are the children of God. All cultures should find their expression in the Catholic Mass.

The difficulty is putting this into practice, especially in communities with members from more than one culture. Receptivity on the part of the pastor is important, too. As he learns about another culture, he'll be more open to using the best of it in worship. Perhaps you, along with other concerned parishioners, might discuss this with your pastor. There are resources and institutes available to assist you in making your worship truly reflect who you are individually and communally.
