Ash Wednesday

Lent begins this coming Wednesday with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time when we are asked to take a good look at our life. Are we living a good, Christian life? Are there areas of life where we are not doing as well as we could be? Do we see the center of life as God and his will, or do we see our own life and will as being the important thing? Lent is a time to grapple with our faults and perhaps disordered lives. It is a time to call upon the grace of God to help us be the best people that we can be. It is a preparation for Easter, in the sense that if we really see the graces that flow from Jesus' resurrection and our own Baptism, we can celebrate Easter as the day when God reaches out to renew and resurrect His people from their sins. The ashes we receive are meant to remind us that "we are dust and to dust we will return." We are not capable of saving ourselves. It is only with God's grace that salvation is possible, and that grace must be freely accepted because we are aware of how needy we are! We invite you to join us at Mass on Ash Wednesday to kick off this season of repentance and renewal. Masses with the distribution of ashes will be at 7:30 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.

Arizona Income Tax Credits.

Donations to CTSO (The Catholic Tuition Support Organization) should be used as tax credits on your Arizona State income tax. If you owe, for example, \$1000 to the State you can redirect that \$1000 to a child whose sponsors are registered members of the Our Lady of the Desert Church and who attend a catholic school in the diocese of Tucson. This will not cost you a dollar. It is a tax credit, not a tax deduction. This year the maximum deduction is \$2,483 for couples and \$1,243 for singles. You do not have to wait until April 15 so that you know how much money you owe to the state. You may estimate the amount based on last year's return. If you donate too much, you merely roll it over for next year's tax. But do not do this several years in a row so that you build up a big balance. If you donate now, then CTSO will send you a letter that you or your accountant can use to fill in the correct amounts on your 2022 Arizona tax forms 323 and 348. Please use code 1699 when completing the form. This scholarship fund is administered by the Knights of Columbus Council 15704 of Our Lady of the Desert Church. 
If only I hadn't been blind to love...





Dear Padre,

I am wondering why Ash Wednesday is sometimes in February and sometimes in March. Who decides when Lent begins, and why is it always different?

The beginning of Lent is determined by the date of Easter, which is a movable feast, unlike Christmas, which is always on December 25. Easter falls on the first Sunday following the first full moon of spring. The first Sunday of Lent is six weeks before, and the Wednesday before the first Sunday of Lent is Ash Wednesday.

This subject has caused division in the Church since the second century, because the Eastern Church and the Western
