# Our Lady of the Desert

#### Sunday, July 2 Rom 6:3-4, 8-11

In this section of Paul's Letter to the Romans, Paul reminds the Romans that when they were Baptized, they were united to Jesus in his death and resurrection. Therefore, Paul encourages them to live as if they were dead to sin, since Jesus already paid the debt due for our sins. Paul always asks his readers to rise above sin, to root it out of their lives. Their life has been purchased by Jesus's passion and resurrection. The power of the resurrection has already started to reign in them as a life dedicated to God and His will.

#### Monday, July 3 Eph 2:19-22

Paul states today that Baptism has changed us. Because of it, we are now part of the Church, the body of Christ. Each of us already carry within us the Spirit of Christ. The power of that Spirit is working to heal us from sin and rebuild us in the image of Christ. Since this mystery exists in all the Baptized, we must strive to be truly one with each other in peace. It is only in such unity that the full presence of Christ can be found.

#### Tuesday, July 4 Gn 19:15-29

Today, we return to the story of Abraham and his nephew, Lot. Lot had moved away from Abraham to a place near Sodom. Now, God is about to destroy that city and the whole plains area because of their huge sins. But God is mindful of Abraham and his love for Lot. He therefore has Lot leave the city for safety before the punishment is carried out. God in His mercy remembers his faithful servant, Abraham. God always remembers His favor towards those whom He loves.

#### Wednesday, July 5 Gn 21:5, 8-20a

Abraham had a son by his slave, Hagar. However, his wife Sarah then bore Isaac, who was the legal heir of Abraham. It was through Isaac that Abraham would become the father of many nations. Sarah is jealous of Ishmael, Hagar's son, and doesn't want him to inherit anything at all from Abraham. So, Abraham sends Hagar and her son away. God, however, is with Ishmael, since he is a son of Abraham. God tends to his needs and promises that he will become the father of a great nation. Ishmael is seen as the father of the Muslim tradition.

#### Thursday, July 6 Gn 22:1b-19

We have the story of Abraham and Isaac today. Abraham, as a test, is asked to sacrifice his son Isaac up to the Lord. However, once God sees that Abraham is obedient, he stops it from happening. Earlier, Isaac had inquired about the lamb to be offered in the sacrifice. Abraham told him that God himself would provide the lamb. Abraham then finds a ram (not a lamb) and offers it up.

Since then, the rabbis have been looking for Abraham's prophesy of God providing the lamb to come true. As Jesus will later begin his public career, John the Baptist will announce, "Behold the Lamb of God." Jesus himself with be the Son sacrificed by a Father (God).

#### Friday, July 7 Gn 23:1-4, 19; 24:1-8, 62-67

Sarah dies today, and Abraham himself is quite old. He sends a servant back to Ur, where he had originally come from, to find a wife for Isaac. The servant returns with Rebekah. In her, Isaac finds relief from his grief over his mother's death. Isaac and Rebekah are now poised to bear a son through whom the promises made to Abraham will be fulfilled. The faithfulness of God continues on!

#### Saturday, July 8 Gn 27:1-5, 15-29

Isaac and Rebekah bear two sons, Esau and Jacob. Esau, as the elder brother, should be the main heir of his father. The blessing and promise God made to Abraham is meant to flow through him. However, Jacob, working with his mother, deceives Isaac. In this way, Jacob receives the blessing and the birth-right from Isaac in place of Esau. Thus, God's promise to make of Abraham a great nation, flows through the trickster Jacob. Even though human nature and sin have entered into the equation, God's promise is still honored.







## Dear Padre,

#### How do we serve everyone in a culturally diverse parish?

In the past it was common to have parishes dedicated to different ethnic groups where such populations were concentrated. In 2010, the US bishops found that 33 percent of all US parishes were culturally diverse, and that's perhaps using a narrow understanding of diversity. Then in 2014, they published *Best Practices for Shared Parishes: So That They May All Be One*, in which they outline a ninemovement process for creating an inclusive parish. The term "shared parishes" describes parish communities in which two or more languages or cultural contexts are present in the ministerial life of



a parish. The fact that there are nine movements is notable. It means that we slowly move toward inclusiveness; we don't simply present a Mass in Spanish and think the job is done.

This brings to mind a parishioner in a parish I served in the Mississippi Delta. This was indeed a "shared parish," with a large African-American population, a significant Spanish-speaking population, and an elderly population of white Americans who expected a more "traditional" Mass with familiar hymns. Rosemary was an Italian-American whose family had lived in the area since the beginning of the nineteenth century. She served as the parish's director of education. Rosemary made it her practice to attend every Mass to welcome people and make them feel at home. She was the perfect example of the first movement toward serving everyone in a shared parish: hospitality. •
