Our Lady of the Desert

Sunday, June 11 1 Cor 10:16-17

Today's second reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians reminds us of our unity with Christ and with each other. Paul tells us that when we eat the body of Christ in the Eucharist and drink his blood, a oneness of life dwells within us. Christ's life within us is united to our life. As a group, then, we all are united to God and we share His life and love with each other. It is because we all share in Christ's life that we become brothers and sisters of each other. All of us share the same life of Christ. For Paul, this unity is very real, and it calls us to live a life of love with each other.

Monday, June 12 2 Cor 1:1-7

Paul today takes up the issue of suffering in life. He says that God always is present to us in times of suffering, offering encouragement and compassion. So too, we, as members of the Body of Christ, must also reach out to join Christ in encouraging our brothers and sisters who are walking through a tough or painful time in life. We must always seek to live the way Jesus lived; to encourage others as he himself does. Compassion and care for one another always has to have an important place in our Christian lives.

Tuesday, June 13 2 Cor 1:18-22

Paul today speaks of the trustworthiness of Jesus's teaching. We can always trust that the way of life he has revealed to us will lead us to God. The presence of the Holy Spirit within us shows us that God has indeed kept His promises. Paul says the Spirit within us is the first installment of this union with God. This union will grow more perfect throughout our lives and reach its perfection in our resurrection. God has begun the work of drawing his people to himself.

Wednesday, June 14 2 Cor 3:4-11

Paul today speaks about the law versus life in the Spirit. Although the law had kept Israel close to God and in covenant with him, the life of the Spirit within us is even more glorious. Christ has freed us from the blind following of the external law to an inner guidance of the Spirit in our lives. The Spirit is constantly working within us to lead us to a more perfect union with God and one another. We can trust the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to lead us to life.

Thursday, June 15 2 Cor 3:15—4:1, 3-6

Paul today insists that the new covenant in Christ far surpasses the old covenant of the law. Though the law was good, it only led to a veiled understanding of God. But now, God has revealed His Full Self to us through the Holy Spirit living within us. We no longer just know about God through laws set up to guide us. Now, we are enlightened by the very presence of God himself inside our bodies. We

know him in faith, not just a reflection of himself.

Friday, June 16 1 Jn 4:7-16

Today is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Therefore, our reading from Paul is interrupted by the Letter of John. John writes about the love of God. We have experienced this love by the fact that God sent his only Son to die for our sins. Only through love is such self-sacrifice possible. John also argues that we who are filled with the love of God through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in our lives and hearts, must also cooperate with that indwelling Spirit by loving one another as God loves us. We too must die to ourselves and live for each other.

Saturday, June 17 2 Cor 5:14-21

Paul speaks today about death as the punishment for sin. However, Paul insists that Christ died in our place. Now, we live. We live for Christ. We live for his will and for the welfare of each other. How can we not love and give our lives to the one who gave his life for us? His death won forgiveness of our sins. We are free of them and called to share that reconciliation we have received from God with one another.







Dear Padre,

I'm eighty-one. When I received first Communion, the nuns told me not to chew the holy Eucharist, but to let it melt in my mouth. Is it wrong to chew it?

It is permitted to chew the host or to let it dissolve in your mouth. The hosts today must be unleavened and made only of flour and water, making it easier for some communicants to dissolve it in their mouths. Unleavened bread doesn't mold or spoil and is more suitable than leavened bread for exposition and adoration. However, for nearly 800 years, the Church used leavened wheat bread for the Eucharist before unleavened wheat bread was introduced into the



Roman rite. Communicants would have had to chew the Eucharist before the modern waferlike host evolved.

Your first Communion instruction on the proper way to consume the Eucharist was an effort to instill in you a deep reverence for the Real Presence of Christ. This profound respect for our Lord in the form of consecrated bread and wine is still desired by the Church. For example, at Mass the priest "reverently consumes the Body of Christ" and "reverently partakes of the Blood of Christ" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 158). Similarly, "when receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence and receives the Body of the Lord from the minister" (GIRM 160). Today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is a special day for us to remember Jesus' gift of his own body that we might be nourished and strengthened for this life's journey.
