

Weekend of June 24-25 Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



Sunday, June 25 Rom 5:12-15

Paul today, uses a very pharisaic way of proving a point. It is a process where an inferior is compared to a superior. The superior always outshines the inferior. In this case, Paul is speaking of the fact that sin and death entered into our lives through the sin of Adam. However, now we have a new Man, Jesus Christ, through whom God's grace and salvation come into our lives. Paul thoroughly believes that Jesus' death and resurrection have flooded the world with God's peace and forgiveness. All we need do is be faithful to that life of Jesus within us.

Monday, June 26 Gn 12:1-9

Our reading today centers on the great promises God made to Abram. He promises land to his offspring. He promises that Abram will be a source of blessing for all peoples. Abram does nothing to deserve this gift. God simply chooses him. In the same way, God, in His mercy, chose each one of us. He has made us His adopted children and promised us eternal life. We do not deserve this. We have not and do not earn it. We have salvation only because God chose us to be His own!

Tuesday, June 27 Gn 13:2, 5-18

Abram, in today's reading separates from his nephew Lot. Their servants have been fighting over land. Abram gives Lot the choice of where he will go, and Abram says he will go to the other side of the area. Here, we see Abram's generosity. He does not insist on having the choice of land; he freely gives it to Lot for the sake of peace between them. Abram is a wonderful example for us today. We too should be willing to do what needs to be done for the sake of peace with others. Selfishness increases conflict, but humility and generosity can decrease conflict.

Wednesday, June 28 Gn 15:1-12, 17-18

Abram has a great doubt in today's reading! God has promised land to his descendants, but since he has no children and he is old, how can God's promise ever come to fruition? God takes him outside in the middle of the day (notice that it gets dark later) and asks him to count the stars. Of course, he is unable to do so, because he cannot even see the stars in the daylight. God replies that the same is true of the promise. Even if Abram cannot see a way for God to fulfill his promise, it will happen. Abram simply must have faith. The same is true for us. Even if we cannot see the signs of God's presence in our lives, he is there! We simply need to trust him!

Thursday, June 29 Acts 12:1-11

Today's first reading is a great example of what we saw yesterday. Peter is in prison and is tightly

watched over by guards. He can see no way out of appearing before Pilate and suffering whatever pain Pilate wishes to send to him. Yet, miraculously, the chains fall off him. The cell door and the outer door of the building where he is held open by themselves, and Paul is set free. God has indeed protected him, even though Peter could not see a way it could happen! Faith still saved him.

Friday, June 30 Gn 17:1, 9-10, 15-22

God, today, promises Abraham a son by his wife Sarah. Sarah is 90 years old by this time! Abraham laughs at the idea of what God has promised can happen. Even though he laughs, God still promises a son who will be the father of a great nation. Once again, if God promises, he will bring it to fulfillment, even if we cannot see how it could possibly happen. Faith is needed. (An interesting joke is that God calls for him to be named Isaac, which means laughter!)

Saturday, July 1 Gn 18:1-15

Today is Sarah's turn to laugh! She overhears Abraham talking with three strangers who happen by. One of them says that Sarah will have a son in the length of a year. Sarah, of course, thinks this is ridiculous because of her age. God's response is not one of anger, but of understanding. He gently chides Sarah, but nevertheless assures her that she can trust God's word. God will get the last laugh (Isaac) in this situation! He understands Sarah's lack of Faith!





Dear Padre,

A friend of mine wants to be cremated. Does the Church permit it?

The Church permits cremation when extraordinary circumstances warrant it. There was never a direct canonical ban on cremation until 1886, simply because it was not widely practiced by the Christian Church; its members preferred inhumation-the traditional form of burial-in hopeful imitation of Christ, whose body was resurrected from the dead. The Church reacted to a proliferation of nineteenth-century cremation societies, primarily in Europe, with a decree that forbade Catholics from membership



in these societies or from cremation (with obvious exceptions made in times of public crisis, plagues, wars, etc.). The Church restated the ban as late as 1926 out of concern that these groups were anti-religious in promoting cremation as an argument against belief in the resurrection.

The Vatican has allowed cremation as an acceptable alternative to burial since 1963, except in cases where irreligious motives are apparent (Canon 1176, No. 3). Nevertheless, "although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in those rites" (No. 413, Order of Christian Funerals, "Appendix 2, Cremation," 1997). Moreover, while the Church permits cremation, the scattering of ashes is forbidden. They are to be reserved with reverence in a sacred place.
