Our Lady of the Desert

Sunday, July 9th Rom 8:9, 11-13

In today's second reading, Paul writes about the flesh vs. the spirit. For Paul, our baptism has put to death the power of the "flesh" in us, that is sin and temptation to sin. We have died to that way of life and have chosen to live for God, that is, in the Spirit. Paul points out that the Spirit of Jesus we received in baptism has made us new creations. The challenge is not to go backward into a "fleshy" existence, but to remain people of the Spirit. The power of the spirit will put the life of the flesh to death in us!

Monday, July 10th Gn 28:10-22a

We once again return to Genesis today. We are back to Isaac's son, Jacob. Jacob is the heir of Isaac through whom God's promise will flow. As Jacob sleeps, he has a dream wherein God tells him that he will give the land to him and his descendants. They will become a source of blessing for the whole world. God promises that he will be with Jacob and protect him on all his journeying. God's love for Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob is still flourishing. God never forgets his promises.

Tuesday, July 11th Gn 32:23-33

Our story today about Jacob is one where he wrestles with a man (angel, or God?). (Jacob has always struggled; first for his brother Esau's birthright, and then with his father-in-law for the right to marry Rebecca.) The man hits him in his hip causing Jacob to limp. The story ends up by commenting on a dietary law for the Jewish people. It points out that since Jacob (now Israel) was hit in the sciatic muscle of his hip socket, his family never eats the sciatic muscle of an animal. At any rate, Jacob receives a blessing from this strange man, a promise that God will always be with him.

Wednesday, July 12th Gn 41:55-57; 42:5-7a, 17-24a

We jump way ahead in the story today. Joseph is in Egypt, where he was taken after his brothers sold him into slavery. He is now second in charge in the country. He has stored a surplus of wheat because he knew a famine was coming. Now, his forethought serves as a way for him to feed the whole world. His own brothers come before him, but do not recognize him. As they bemoan their bad luck (one brother must be left behind in prison) Joseph turns away to hide the fact that he cries over their pain. Despite what they did to him, Joseph is still sympathetic to them and willing to eventually forgive.

Thursday, July 13th Gn 44:18-21, 23b-29; 45:1-5

Jacob had two sons from his favorite wife. Joseph desires to see his younger brother. He has ar-

ranged for the others to bring him back to Egypt in order to free the captive brother from yesterday's reading. Joseph hears about his father's mourning over the chance that he may also lose this son. When Joseph hears of this, he breaks down in tears and reveals his identity to his brothers. In forgiveness, Joseph states that it was all God's will so that Joseph could save his family from the drought. God has a way of bringing good, even from bad!

Friday, July 14th Gn 46:1-7, 28-30

Today, Jacob is about to go to Egypt. Naturally, he fears going there, but God speaks to him saying that he will be with him and protect him. God further promises that one day Jacob's family, which will by then be a great nation, will return to the land that God promised would be theirs. It will be through the ministry of Moses that this promise will be fulfilled.

Saturday, July 15th Gn 49:29-32; 50:15-26a

Today, Jacob dies. His sons are told to take his body to the cave where Abraham, Isaac, and their wives were buried. This has become the family plot. Joseph's brothers are now afraid again. They fear that with their father now dead, Joseph might seek to punish them for what they did to him. However, Joseph refuses to play God by judging them. He points out that though they intended to hurt him, God had actually allowed it to save the world from hunger. Joseph faithfully forgives his brothers and arranges for his own burial in the cave with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.







Dear Padre,

In 1961, I became a member of the Catholic Church when I married a Catholic man. I divorced him and left the Church in 2007. Now I am a member of the United Methodist Church. Is it possible for me to rejoin the Catholic Church, and if so, what are the requirements? I miss "the church of my heart," the Catholic Church.

It certainly is possible for you to come back, and now is the time to do it. Simply return to your local parish and begin attending Mass regularly. Before you receive the Eucharist again, you should make an appointment to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation. If you



are not quite ready to do that, at least begin with coming to church regularly. When you are ready, introduce yourself to the priest and tell him that you would like to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation because you have been away from the Church for a number of years. The priest might encourage you to come to confession at a regularly scheduled time or perhaps make an appointment so you can spend more time together.

It is not necessary to go to classes or to rejoin the RCIA, but there may be some adult faith formation classes you could participate in. Again, your priest or parish could guide you. That tug you are feeling is nothing less than the Holy Spirit. Welcome Home! •
