Our Lady of the Desert

August 13th Rom 9:1-5

Paul, today, speaks of his love for his fellow Jews. He grieves over their failure to accept Christ. After all that God did for them, they still failed to believe in the Messiah when he came. Paul's grieving over his people's rejection of Jesus is very similar to Jesus himself grieving over Jerusalem in the gospels where he speaks of wanting to gather them under his wings like a hen with her chicks, but they refused. We too should grieve over those around us who refuse to give themselves to Christ. We must always pray for them and give them a good example through our own way of living.

August 14th Dt 10:12-22

Moses continues to speak to the children (now adults) of the Hebrews led out of Egypt. He reminds them of how much God loved their ancestors in the faith, and even today claimed them, the children of these past generations, as a people of his own. Moses calls them to "fear" the Lord. This does not mean that they should be afraid of God. Rather, it means that they should love God so much, that they would fear to hurt him through sin. The same is true for us. We are called to love God so much that we would never want to offend him. This gift of "Fear of the Lord" comes to us from God and through the Holy Spirit. We always should remember to pray for this gift!

August 15th 1 COR 15:20-27

Paul writes today about the fact that Jesus conquered death. He reminds the people that through his death on the cross, Jesus has done this. He speaks of the fact that all humans were made subject to sin because of Adam. Just so, it was through Jesus's obedience and love that we too are now under the power of life. At the end of the world, Jesus will return to bring us into the fulness of life with God forever. We simply need to be faithful as we await that time. Victory is assured if we want it!

August 16th Dt 34:1-12

We return today to Moses. Moses has served God for many years as he has led the people. It is now time for him to die. But, before that happens, God shows him the wondrous land that he had promised to give to the children of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Moses is buried and the people mourn him for 30 days. Joshua will now be the new leader of the people. He will finish what Moses began. He will lead the people to conquer the land and have it as their own.

August 17th Jos 3:7-10a, 11, 13-17

Joshua is about to lead the people across the Jordan River and into the promised land. As a sign that God is with them and leading them through Joshua, something happens that is very similar to what happened with Moses at the Red Sea. As the bearers of the ark of the covenant step into the river, its waters stop flowing and the people cross on dry land.

Obviously, Joshua enjoys the same strength of God's presence as did Moses. God shows that he did not abandon the people upon Moses's death.

August 18th Jos 24:1-13

Joshua, in today's reading, reminds the people of all that God has done for them from the time of Abraham all the way until the present day. God has been leading them and feeding them and fighting for them. His love for His people has been truly great and remarkable. Joshua bids them to never forget all of this. Remembering will keep them thankful and faithful. We too need to reflect on our own life and upon all the goodness God has shown to us. If we remember, how could we ever turn our backs on this God who has loved us so much?

August 19th Jos 24:14-29

Today's reading concludes yesterday's reading. After asking the people to remember all that God has done for them, Joshua now calls on them to respond. They must make up their minds whose people they are. They can serve the false gods of their ancestors or of the people they now live among in the promised land, or they can choose to follow the Lord, the God of their fathers. The people say they choose to follow the Lord. Joshua dies and is buried. He has done his job in bringing the people into the land. He has set them up as God's special people! However, as the rest of their history will show, the people will end up going astray, because they will forget to remember the goodness God has shown to them. Let us not make that same mistake in our lives!





Dear Padre,

At what precise point in the Mass does the bread and wine turn into the Body and Blood of Christ?

For many centuries, thinkers in the Western and Eastern Churches have pondered this question. Some say the moment of consecration happens at the beginning of the sentence, "This is my body." Others say it happens at the conclusion of that sentence. Still others claim it happens sometime during the sentence. The same theories were proposed about the consecration of the cup. From the Eastern Churches, the theory



was raised that it wasn't the eucharistic narrative that was consecratory, but rather the prayer of invocation to the Holy Spirit known as the epiclesis.

These theories continue to be debated, but to what avail? Even the Catechism of the Catholic Church does not specify when the consecration happens (CCC 1375-81). But knowing the precise moment it happens doesn't seem to be as important as simply knowing that the elements of bread and wine over which the prayer is prayed do become for us the Body and Blood of Christ.

This mystery of faith, moreover, adds another dimension to our lives: transformation into Christ. Whether we share in Communion at the liturgy or contemplate the Lord in the tabernacle, the loving call of the Spirit is to change our hearts. Specifically, when does that happen to us? One never knows for sure. But by participation in the mystery of faith, we're changed ever more deeply into the One whose Body and Blood we share.
