

Our Lady of the Desert

August 20th Rom 11:13-15, 29-32

Paul is writing to Gentiles. He acknowledges that he became the "Apostle to the Gentiles" because of the rejection of the gospel that he found among the Jews. Paul sees the Jewish objectors as carrying out God's will to bring mercy to all the world. Even though they do not know what they did, God worked through them. However, Paul holds out hope for the Jews. He states that now God will work through the Gentiles to bring his mercy to the Jews. God's mercy will always win!

August 21st Jgs 2:11-19

The people are now settled in the promised land. Unfortunately, they have forgotten all that Moses taught them about fidelity to God. They have begun to worship other gods, as their neighbors around them did. As a result of their turning from God, bad things happen in their lives. They come to their senses and cry out to God for deliverance, and he hears them and sends a rescuer. However, once the rescuer is gone, the people fall back to their sinful ways. The sequence repeats itself. The question for them (and us!) is when will we finally learn our lesson? Only fidelity to God will bring safety and happiness into our lives.

August 22nd Jgs 6:11-24a

Today we hear of the call of the first judge, Gideon. Once again, God surprises. He does not call the rich and mighty, but rather a man whose family is the lowest of all in the tribe, and who is the lowest of all those in his father's house. Gideon is slow to believe, and God is patient with him. Finally, after a miraculous accepting of a sacrifice by God, Gideon is convinced, and takes up his role as savior. Lowly people can do mighty things with the help of God!

August 23rd Jgs 9:6-15

Gideon dies in today's reading. The people right away forget about him and God. They choose one from their own clan to be the ruler over them. They attack 69 of the 70 sons of Gideon and murder them. Only Jotham survived. He prophesies that because they have turned away from God and forgotten all that God did for them through Gideon, disaster would fall upon them. Again, the message is that when we forget God and his love and mercy, bad things happen to us.

August 24th Rv 21:9b-14

Because of a feast day today, we leave Judges and have a reading from Revelation. The seer is presented with a vision of the "bride of them Lamb." He sees a new, heavenly Jerusalem coming down from heaven. The names of the 12 tribes of Israel and the names of the Apostles are written on the stones of the walls. Obviously, this new city represents the Church. The Church is the bride of Jesus. It is in the Church that Jesus takes pride, and his love and commitment to her is compared to that of a husband for his wife. God holds us in truly great

love and respect. He is always there for us!

Our Lady of the Desert

August 25th Ru 1:1, 3-6, 14b-16, 22

Today, we have a passage from the Book of Ruth. This is a story of things that happened during the time of the Judges. Naomi and her husband leave their homeland and journey off to pagan lands because there is a drought in Israel. There, her two sons marry local women. One of these is Ruth. After Naomi's husband and 2 sons both die, Naomi wants to return home to the land of Israel. Ruth, who loves her, refuses to let her go alone. She, through a felt call to love and honor her mother-in-law, goes back to Israel with her. Eventually, Ruth will become the great grandmother of King David. God often calls to us through our relationships with others. If we heed his call, we can be a source of great blessing to them and to the world. All very ordinary, yet very extraordinary!

August 26th Ru 2:1-3, 8-11; 4:13-17

Ruth goes out to work in the fields of a relative of Naomi. The relative, Boaz, sees her and knows that she helped Naomi and was so loving towards her. Because of this knowledge, he falls in love with Ruth and marries her. Soon, she has a baby named Obed. Obed will be the grandfather of King David. Love for Naomi has won great honor and reward for Ruth! It has changed her life and brought her great joy!







Dear Padre,

Why are the Scripture readings for Mass so piecemeal? We read part of a verse then jump to another part. Doesn't reading it like this distort the meaning of the passage?

The readings for Mass are in a book called the *Lectionary*. Our current *Lectionary* was set up after the Second Vatican Council. It uses a three-year cycle for the Sunday readings, so over three years we hear the majority of the Bible at Mass. Its introduction states, "The present Order of Readings for Mass, then, is an arrangement of biblical readings that provides the faithful with a knowledge of the whole of God's word, in a pattern suited to the purpose" (General Introduction to the Lectionary, Second Edition, 60).

So the readings are not "piecemeal" but rather arranged so that we are exposed to the whole of God's word within three years. At times a given reading may not be complete—for example, the second reading for today is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans, chapter eleven, verses 13–15 and 29–32. This is



done not only for brevity but for clarity. Those who organized the Lectionary thought that this excerpt made the message clearer or gave better emphasis to a point in the reading. It certainly is good to get out your Bible and read the whole section so you can see what is missing, but when the word is proclaimed at Mass, the current arrangement is most effective.
