We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



### October 15th Phil 4:12-14, 19-20

Paul responds to a monetary gift he received from Philippi. He thanks them for their thoughtfulness, but also lets them know of how he looks at life. He states that he is satisfied with whatever comes his way in life. Whether he is wanting or whether he has enough makes no difference. His trust is in God no matter what. Paul's radical trust in Christ to take care of him led to a sense of peace in his life, no matter what was going on. We too can find such peace if we learn to trust Jesus and his love for us!

#### October 16th Rom 1:1-7

Today we have the beginning of Paul's letter to the Romans. It in, Paul states that God has called the Christians of Rome to "be holy." This is how Paul sums up what it means to be a Christian. A Christian is one called by God to be united with Jesus his Son through the Holy Spirit. The aim of Christianity is simply to grow in holiness, that is, to grow closer in love to God every day. That should always be our main concern in life.

### October 17th Rom 1:16-25

Paul speaks today of a general way in which all people are able to know God. God's will is to enter a relationship of love with everyone he created. He reveals much about himself in creation. He reveals himself as a lover of beauty, order, and goodness. All of creation can lead us to ponder and know the One who created all this beauty. Paul bemoans the fact that some people close their minds and hearts to this revelation. We too are called to prayer and to reflection upon our lives and the world around us. God reveals himself to us and calls us into union with him through very natural and ordinary means. We just need to pay attention!

### October 18th 2 Tm 4:10-17b

Today is the Feast of St Luke. Luke is mentioned in today's reading as being a companion and fellow missionary with Paul. Paul then warns Timothy to beware of a certain Alexander the Coppersmith. He has been opposing the faith. Paul bemoans the fact that the first time Alexander opposed him, no one but Christ stood by him. It was due to Christ that he was able to stand against the persecution of his enemies. Timothy would be wise to put faith in no one but Jesus!

### October 19th Rom 3:21-30

Paul speaks of the fact that all people are sinners, whether Jew or Greek. All are forgiven through faith. If we believe and try to draw close to God, he will draw close to us. We cannot earn this salvation by works of the law. Only an interior faith in our hearts can save us. Whether we are Jew or Greek, we will be saved through Faith, not the Jewish laws. Jesus's death and resurrection have brought salvation. We participate in that salvation because of faith. It is a gift open to all.

### October 20th Rom 4:1-8

Paul continues to write about salvation through faith. He points out that Abraham was saved. Yet, no law existed at the time of Abraham. Therefore, the following of the law is not what leads to salvation. It is only faith that saves. In faith, we believe we are loved by God, and we open ourselves to that love. If we are open, God will grace us with his love and salvation!





### October 21st Rom 4:13, 16-18

Once again, we have Paul talking about Abraham and his faith. He points out that God said Abraham would be the father of many nations. It is through the faith of Abraham that salvation is shared by all the nations. Abraham was not an example of living by the law (it did not exist in his day!), but of living by faith. Our living by Faith will always result in God's mercy being poured upon us!

### Arizona Income Tax Credits.

Donations to CTSO (The Catholic Tuition Support Organization) should be used as tax credits on your Arizona State income tax. If you owe, for example, \$1000 to the State you can redirect that \$1000 to a child whose sponsors are registered members of the Our Lady of the Desert Church and who attend a catholic school in the diocese of Tucson. This will not cost you a dollar. It is a tax credit, not a tax deduction. This year the maximum deduction is \$2,609 for couples and \$1,307 for singles. You do not have to wait until April 15 so that you know how much money you owe to the state. You may estimate the amount based on last year's return. If you donate too much, you merely roll it over for next year's tax. But do not do this several years in a row so that you build up a big balance. If you donate now, then CTSO will send you a letter that you or your accountant can use to fill in the correct amounts on your 2023 Arizona tax forms 323 and 348. Please use code 1699 when completing the form. This scholarship fund is administered by the Knights of Columbus Council 15704 of Our Lady of the Desert Church. ## **Dear Padre**,

### My prayer-group leader is encouraging us to write our own prayers for our meetings. Don't you need some formal religious training to write prayers? Will our prayers count?

It's given to every human being to be able to pray. On the level of the spiritual life, prayer is as basic as breathing is to physical life. Everyone at every moment has the grace to say a prayer.

Sometimes I ask people, "Do you pray?" At times they tell me they don't. Then I ask them, "Well, do you talk with God?" And most answer, "Of course." That's praying.



When writing your prayers, I suggest you use this ancient definition as inspiration: Prayer is the raising of the mind and heart to God. I'm sure your prayers will be that in word and feeling, and they will count.

When writing more formal prayers, it's nice to include the prayer elements the Church considers important: adoration of God, contrition and sorrow for sin, thanksgiving for life and for God's care of us in good times and bad, and petition for what we desperately need in our poverty. And for you, a final word. Remember that no matter how bad things may get, no matter how out of control things feel, you always have the gift and power of saying a prayer. Especially in time of temptation—when things really go bad—ask Mary your Mother to pray with you.
