Our Lady of the Desert

November 12th 1 Thes 4:13-18

Paul today writes about loved one who have died. It is so easy to think that they are gone. But, Paul states that they are merely "asleep." He points out that on the last day, they shall rise and we shall all meet together again. Death is not an end of life, but a transition to a fuller life. As we remember our deceased loved ones this month, we should always thank God for the love they brought into our lives. We should also remember that they still love us, and they are waiting for us to join them in heaven.

November 13th Wis 1:1-7

Our reading from the Book of Wisdom states that God's Spirit fills this world. If we seek to keep our minds and hearts on the doing of God's will, we will receive the wisdom we need. Faith and trust are the only preconditions. So, Wisdom bids us to love justice and to seek God with purity of heart. Sin and injustice separate us from wisdom.

November 14th Wis 2:23–3:9

Today's reading from Wisdom speaks once again about those have died. It, like Thessalonians on Sunday, declares that though the dead seem to be no more, in truth they live on. They are in the hands of God. They are in peace. If they were faithful to God, He will be faithful to them. They will dwell forever in the fullness of His love.

November 15th Wis 6:1-11

The author of The Book of Wisdoms speaks to kings and rulers today. These people are not free to do as they please. God has placed them over the people to guard the people and bring justice to them. If they fail in their responsibility, they will face the punishment their deeds deserve. God's wisdom is available to them, so they won't yield to sinful ways. They simply need to remember and look for it.

November 16th Wis 7:22b–8:1

Today we have an ode to Wisdom. The author sings the praises of Wisdom. He points out that Wisdom is always with God and works according to his ways. If we live in cooperation with Wisdom, we will truly live in the light. All things will be revealed to us. Darkness will lose power over us.

November 17th Wis 13:1-9

Today's reading from Wisdom speaks about those who seek God. An understanding of God can be deduced from looking at the beauty and order. We see that God loves beauty and order! However, the author also mourns over those who, instead of using creation to get to the creator, see the creatures themselves as God. They have all that they need to get to the truth, but fail to go there. Such people will find punishment. God holds out life to all. We simply need to think and reflect on what we see and experience in creation and in God's word.





November 18th Wis 18:14-16; 19:6-9

Today's reading pictures God's Word as love coming to the rescue of his people. It speaks of several incidents from Israel's past as showing the presence of God's word. When they were thirsty, water flowed for them in the desert. When trapped by the red sea, a dry pathway through the waters led them to deliverance. If we faithfully follow God's ways, we find life.








The 10:00 Choir is looking for singers and

Contemplation is an ancient Christian tradition rooted in the Scriptures and the life of Jesus. It developed in an age of uncertainty, similar to our own, attracting thousands of lay men and women who yearned to lose themselves in God. These early Christians, who practiced a lifestyle that we describe by the term "contemplative," left a rich heritage with explicit instructions on living the New Life in Christ.

Contemplation is the fruit of personal practice and experience. The practice is the ancient Christian tradition of awareness not only at specific times of prayer, but while peeling potatoes, washing dishes, cleaning, gardening, sleeping and so forth. It's a practice that fulfills the directive of St. Paul, "Pray always."

Contemplation is often mistakenly identified with monasticism. For the first Christian contemplatives, it was simply the Christian way of living moment to moment with the grace of God. The testimony of their lives has inspired countless individuals throughout the centuries whose deepest desire was to conform themselves to Christ.





Dear Padre,

I was taught that Catholic churches are built on consecrated ground. How can a church be torn down and replaced by a shopping mall if it's sacred ground?

Church buildings are blessed and considered by the Church to be sacred places. But when they're damaged and can no longer be repaired or their repair is impractical or they no longer effectively serve their purpose for the faithful of God, the bishop can remove that blessing. By doing this, the bishop opens them for nonsacred use. Subsequently, they can be torn down or sold, as long as the new purpose is not scandalous to the people of God.

In the end, what is truly sacred is not the brick and mortar or even the soil, but the purpose for which they were built. Churches are blessed and declared sacred because we perform sacred rituals within them. When those rituals are no longer being performed in that location, there is no longer a need for them to be declared sacred.



When a church is closed, it is often a sad event. Many people carry deep emotional ties to their parish churches. But a diocese cannot always maintain all of its churches. Catholic populations shift, local needs change. Money is limited, and good stewardship demands that bishops sometimes make the difficult decision to close or merge parishes. Remember what is truly important and of ultimate and sacred value—our worship and service of God. •
