

# Our Lady of the Desert

#### November 19th 1 Thes 5:1-6

Paul says in today's second reading that "the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night." There will be no warning of the end of the world. Yet, we as Christians know well that that day is coming. We should be living our lives in such a way that we will find ourselves ready and prepared for the end, whenever it does come about. Paul encourages us to live in the light (the knowledge of what will come). He begs the people to not live in a way that would show them to be paying no attention to what they know. We must honestly approach our lives.

#### November 20th 1 Mc 1:10-15, 41-43, 54-57, 62-63

Today we start reading from The Book of Maccabees. In today's story, we find many Jewish persons in Jerusalem who want to enter into alliances with the Greeks, who are the world power. They begin to turn their backs on their Jewish faith and to live to faith life of the Greeks. The Greek officials even go so far as to erect an idol on the altar of sacrifice in the temple. Still, even though many of their neighbors and family members have betrayed the Jewish Faith, many of the people held firm to the faith they had been taught. A good question for us might be: If others around us were to give up beliefs or ways of life that our Church teaches, would we go along, or would we be faithful.

#### November 21st 2 Mc 6:18-31

Today, we meet a man named Eleazar. He is one of the Jewish faithful who clung to his faith. When he is about to be put to death because he would not eat pork (which was unlawful for a Jew), his friends try to save him. They suggest that he supply another type of meat that can be eaten. They would simply pretend it was pork. However, Eleazar refuses. He does not want to take the chance of being a bad example to the younger Jews. He would rather die than lead them astray through a bad example. He dies instead and becomes an example of faithfulness and virtue.

#### November 22nd 2 Mc 7:1, 20-31

Today, our story from Maccabees centers on a mother of seven sons. The Greeks are trying to force them to turn from their faith. Even though the mother knows that if they refuse to eat the forbidden food they will die, she still encourages them to be faithful. She would rather see them die faithful, than to live unfaithfully. She reminds the youngest son that if he dies for his faith, he will meet his mother again in the life to come. What an amazing mother! She prefers saving her sons souls rather than just saving their bodies. That is love!

#### November 23rd 1 Cor 1:3-9

HAPPY THANKSGIVING! Today, Paul cries out in thanks to God for the people of Corinth. He

says that God has blessed them with his Word and Teachings. The Corinthians, in turn, have accepted those graces and held them firm in their hearts. Paul testifies that God will therefore give them the grace necessary to persevere in the faith. Such perseverance will lead to fellowship with Christ.



#### November 24th 1 Mc 4:36-37, 52-59

Today, we return to The Book of Maccabees. We see the beginnings of the great Jewish Feast of Hanukkah. The Maccabbes have led a revolt and reclaimed the temple. They destroy the idols erected by the Greeks and rededicate the temple and its altar to God. Their faithfulness has led to a renewal of faith in the land.

#### November 25th 1 Mc 6:1-13

The king of the Greeks is filled with sorrow today. He hears that his armies have been defeated by two different enemies (including Jerusalem). He knows that he will soon die. He admits that his destruction is due to the shameful practices he tried to introduce in Jerusalem. The writer of this book firmly believed that God was fighting for His people. When adversity comes, God's love and protection will always win.



The testimony of their lives has inspired countless individuals throughout the centuries whose deepest desire was to conform themselves to Christ.



## Dear Padre,

My grandmother says Catholics used to fast from midnight until they received Communion. When did the fasting time change to only one hour, and why?

The ancient discipline of fasting before Communion became a universal practice by the fifth century. Until 1953, those who would receive holy Communion refrained from consuming food, water, and medicine from midnight to the time of Communion. In 1953 and 1957, Pope Pius XII reduced the fast from food to three hours and from water for one hour (Christus Dominus and Sacram Communionem).



In 1966, Pope St. Paul VI further reduced the fast to one hour and allowed water and medicine at any time (Paenitemini). In 1973, he reduced the fast for the sick and elderly to fifteen minutes before Communion when one hour is prohibitive (Immensae Caritatis).

The loosening of the restrictions was in no way intended to lessen the reverence for the holy Eucharist. The changes were made to allow as many Catholics as possible to receive the Eucharist, which can be difficult when priests are in short supply. For the same reason, *Immensae Caritatis* also allowed the practice of having extraordinary ministers give Communion. Despite the changes to the Communion fast, unity and uniformity have been maintained. And of course, Catholics are free to fast before Communion beyond the duration and degree currently prescribed.
