Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe

Our Lady of the Desert

November 26th 1 Cor 15:20-26, 28

Paul, today, says that through the sin of Adam, death comes to all people. He further states that through the faithfulness and the death and resurrection of Jesus, life comes to all people. He presents the resurrection of Jesus as "the first fruits." Jewish thought always considered the first fruits of a plant as the best. These first fruits were offered up in sacrifice as a thanksgiving offering. However, they promised an abundance of fruits still to come. So, Jesus's resurrection promises a new, more full life to come. Paul says this will happen at the end of time.

November 27th Dn 1:1-6, 8-20

Today we read from the Book of the Prophet Daniel. This book takes place during the exile. Daniel and three other Jews are part of a group of Jews the foreign king wishes to retrain and make a part of his advisers. They are all to be fed and trained for three years. They would eat food which was forbidden to them. However, Daniel and the other three convince a servant to feed them only vegetables and water. At the end of the test period, they are healthier than all the others. Because they are faithful to God's law, they are blessed with many gifts. Chief among these was wisdom.

November 28th Dn 2:31-45

The king had a dream. He calls upon Daniel to interpret it for him. Daniel says that the dream predicts the current kingdom, followed by three others that will be lesser in greatness. Eventually, they will be replaced by a kingdom set up by God. It will be a kingdom that will never end. Of course, we Christians see this as being a prediction of the Kingdom of Jesus.

November 29th Dn 5:1-6, 13-14, 16-17, 23-28

The son of the original king has come to the throne. He throws a party for some of his lords. They use the liturgical vessels from the temple in Jerusalem for their cups. A wrist and hand appear and write on the wall. Daniel is brought in to decipher the writing. He tells the king that he has abused the vessels of the temple and met with God's anger and disapproval. His kingdom will not last. It will be given over to his enemies. God is always ultimately in charge. If we oppose him, we will suffer the consequences. If we honor Him, we will find life.

November 30th Rom 10:9-18

Paul states today that faith in the heart will lead to salvation. But, for people to believe, they must first have someone speak the word to them. Paul announces that God's will is to be heard and understood by everyone. He uses the voices of prophets, but also uses nature as a way of speaking his love to his people. His love and invitation are for all people, both Jewish and Gentile. Our job is to open our ears so we can hear and to open our eyes so that we may see. Prayer and reflection help us to do this!

December 1st Dn 7:2-14

Today's vision of the four great beasts represents the four kingdoms Daniel had spoken about earlier. However, He then speaks of one "like a son of man" who comes on the clouds of heaven and is given an unending kingdom by God. This title of Son of Man was the title Jesus used more often than any other to speak about himself. Jesus is the eternal king who is to rule forever.



December 2nd Dn 7:15-27

Today, we have more about the beasts from yesterday. Specifically, our reading centers on the 4th beast (Rome). Though this kingdom will be powerful and control the whole world, it will fail in the end. Then God will present a new kingdom to his people. Of course, we view this as being Jesus's reign in our lives. Daniel testifies that in the end, all people will bow to the power of this God appointed king.





Contemplation is an ancient Christian tradition rooted in the Scriptures and the life of Jesus. It developed in an age of uncertainty, similar to our own, attracting thousands of lay men and women who yearned to lose themselves in God. These early Christians, who practiced a lifestyle that we describe by the term "contemplative," left a rich heritage with explicit instructions on living the New Life in Christ.

Contemplation is the fruit of personal practice and experience. The practice is the ancient Christian tradition of awareness not only at specific times of prayer, but while peeling potatoes, washing dishes, cleaning, gardening, sleeping and so forth. It's a practice that fulfills the directive of St. Paul, "Pray always."

Contemplation is often mistakenly identified with monasticism. For the first Christian contemplatives, it was simply the Christian way of living moment to moment with the grace of God. The testimony of their lives has inspired countless individuals throughout the centuries whose deepest desire was to conform themselves to Christ.




Dear Padre,

In the liturgy, how do a solemnity, a feast day, and a memorial differ?

Celebrations in the Church calendar are named according to their rank or importance. Solemnity is the highest rank. The next rank is feast, celebrating an event in the life of Christ, Mary, the apostles, martyrs, and a few other important saints.

Solemnities are usually celebrated by the whole Church, but celebrations may be made solemnities for local churches. For instance, Our Lady of Guadalupe is a solemnity in Mexico and a feast in the United States.

A memorial commemorates the day a saint died. An obligatory memorial is celebrated by every church in a diocese or country. The memorial of Redemptorist St. John Neumann, for example, is obligatory in the United States because of his historical contribution to the American Church as the fourth bishop of Philadelphia. It's also obligatory in Redemptorist churches around the world.



Optional memorials are saints' days an individual priest can celebrate Monday through Saturday if he chooses. For

example, Jesuit St. Robert Bellarmine's memorial is obligatory in Jesuit churches or in churches named for him, but it's optional everywhere else.

During Ordinary Time, solemnities that fall on Sunday are celebrated, but feasts and memorials that fall on Sunday are not. During Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, some solemnities that fall on Sunday are transferred to a weekday because of the importance of these seasons.
