

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.

Our Lady of the Desert

November 5th 1 Thes 2:7b-9, 13

Paul today speaks of the Thessalonians as receiving his teachings, not as the word of man, but as the Word of God. Even though the Thessalonians loved Paul because of his care for them and his dedication to them, they were able to see beyond that friendship to God's presence. They built their lives on following God's word, and it has profited them greatly. We too are called to build our lives on God's word, not necessarily on the preacher!

November 6th Rom 11:29-36

Paul writes today of the call of the Jewish nation. Even though many Jews have refused to believe in Jesus, God has not abandoned them. After all, God's gifts and call are irrevocable. Paul points out that by showing mercy to the Gentiles in plain sight of the Jews, God has caused them to take heed of this perceived affront. He did this as a way of offering mercy to them as well. Once again, God's mercy and love are boundless!

November 7th Rom 12:5-16ab

Paul today encourages the Community in Rome to truly live love. He councils them to anticipate each other in doing good. They should not wait to be treated respectfully before they treat others with respect. They need to offer forgiveness, not revenge. They need to refrain from thinking they are better than anyone else. Love should lead to service of others, not to being served by others.

November 8th Rom 13:8-10

Paul tells the Roman Christians that they owe nothing to anyone other than love. Love must be at the center of their lives. In loving others, we never seek to hurt them. Therefore, in love the whole law of God is obeyed, for God's law exists to build up love and justice in the world. If we love our neighbors as we love ourselves, the world will be a better place for us all.

November 9th 1 Cor 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul today uses a comparison. He compares his preaching to the Corinthians with a person building a house. He states that Jesus must always be the foundation. Paul laid that foundation faithfully. As the rest of the building continues to be built up, nothing new should be added. We cannot build our lives on what we want, or what others may want for us, if such wants are contrary to God's will. We must remember that our lives are to be the temple of the Holy Spirit, not our own temple.

November 10th Rom 15:14-21

Paul tells the Roman Community that he has always faithfully served God in his building up of the Kingdom in others. He never preached to those who may have already heard the Word, but always spoke to the catechized so that he could be sure the foundation was firm, that is, that Jesus and the truth were always the foundation for the faith of his hearers. Paul has always sought to do the will of God, not his own will.

November 11th Rom 16:3-9, 16, 22-27

Paul closes his Letter to the Romans by mentioning many names of individuals that they knew quite well. Paul always acknowledged that the work of building up the church was not his alone. He simply did his part. By mentioning these others, Paul acquires the trust of the community. They can believe him based on the fact that he works as one with people they trust. In the end, it is really Christ Jesus himself who works through all these people to bring his love and mercy to all the world.


Book of Revelation



Contemplation is an ancient Christian tradition rooted in the Scriptures and the life of Jesus. It developed in an age of uncertainty, similar to our own, attracting thousands of lay men and women who yearned to lose themselves in God. These early Christians, who practiced a lifestyle that we describe by the term "contemplative," left a rich heritage with explicit instructions on living the New Life in Christ.

Contemplation is the fruit of personal practice and experience. The practice is the ancient Christian tradition of awareness not only at specific times of prayer, but while peeling potatoes, washing dishes, cleaning, gardening, sleeping and so forth. It's a practice that fulfills the directive of St. Paul, "Pray always."

Contemplation is often mistakenly identified with monasticism. For the first Christian contemplatives, it was simply the Christian way of living moment to moment with the grace of God. The testimony of their lives has inspired countless individuals throughout the centuries whose deepest desire was to conform themselves to Christ.

Thank you for your generous support and financial contributions to our 2022 capital campaign, *Restoration Beyond the Pew.* The purpose for the campaign was to address multi-deferred maintenance issues. The administration set a goal of \$250.000.00; the final amount received was \$253,624.63.

At the beginning of the campaign, we promised transparency and accountability. This letter summarizes repairs completed and expenditures to date for the Renewal Center and the Redemptorist' residence. The remaining \$75,732.02 will used for continued projects. 



Dear Padre,

I would like to do more spiritual reading, but everything I've tried is either over my head or too sweet and pious for me. Do you have suggestions for any down-to-earth authors?

You might try reading shorter works. More is not necessarily better. Consider several publications available at Liquori.org. In My Own Words is a series of books that gathers excerpts from different authors: Dorothy Day, Sr. Thea Bowman, Pope St. John Paul II, and others. Also consider the Wisdom series for Advent and Christmas or Lent and Easter. These include the writings of ancients and a few more current authors like Pope Francis, Henri Nouwen, and Thomas Merton. Daybreaks for Advent and Lent are booklets of short meditations for each day of each season. Catholic Update, a four-page newsletter from Liquori, features indepth articles on contemporary topics written by expert authors.

C. S. Lewis was a prolific and popular Christian author. His *Mere Christianity* is practical and informative. A Grief Observed is a beautiful meditation for those who have lost someone dear to them, as is Henri Nouwen's In Memoriam. Merton's New Seeds of Contemplation has inspired readers since it was first published in 1949.

Finally, the best place to start might be the Gospel of Mark-not to study or analyze. Rather, read it just to get to know Jesus a little better.

A WORD FROM POPE FRANCIS

People today are attracted by things that are faster and faster: rapid Internet connections, speedy cars and planes, instant relationships. But at the same time we see a desperate need for calmness, I would even say slowness. Is the Church still able to move slowly: to take the time to listen, to have the patience to mend and reassemble?

MEETING WITH BISHOPS OF BRAZIL IN RIO DE JANEIRO, JULY 27, 2013
