Our Lady of the Desert

December 24th Rom 16:25-27

Paul praises God today for His plan for Salvation for all people. Hints of this plan can be seen in the Old Testament writings. The fulness of the plan is made visible in the death and resurrection of Jesus. God's plans are eternal, and they are life-filled. In Jesus, all people find life and redemption.

December 25th Acts 13:16-17, 22-25

Merry Christmas!! In today's reading from The Acts of the Apostles, Paul speaks of God's plan of salvation. Paul says it started with the call of the patriarchs, continued through the time when the people were in Egypt, through the time of David, where God promised that one of David's sons would sit on his throne forever. Jesus is this son of David who reigns forever as our Lord and King.

December 26th Acts 6:8-10; 7:54-59

On this Feast of St Stephen, we have the story of his martyrdom. Luke records that Stephen was filled with a wisdom that could not be overcome by his foes. This led them to great anger. When Stephen shared with them a vision he had of Jesus standing in power at the right hand of God, their fury overtook them. They attacked Stephen and stoned him to death. Luke also introduces us to a man named Saul (the future Paul) who concurs in the death of Stephen.

December 27th 1 Jn 1:1-4

John today declares that the plan and love of God that we have heard from the beginning has now been seen by the Apostles in the life of Jesus. The Apostles faithfully shared with all around them what they saw and heard in the life of Jesus. They did this because it was God's will to draw all people into union with Himself and with each other. Only in such fellowship will we ever experience true joy.

December 28th 1 Jn 1:5—2:2

John today writes that in God there is no darkness but only light. If we claim to have fellowship with him, but continue to walk in darkness (sin), we are liars. But, Jesus' blood, shed for us on the cross, brings us forgiveness and cleanses us from all darkness and sin. We are now called to live only in the light, to overcome sin in our lives. Yet, if we do sin out of weakness, Jesus pleads for us before God, and will win forgiveness for us.

December 29th 1 Jn 2:3-11

John writes today that we can know we are in Christ if we walk in light and sin has no place in our lives. He says we are called to love our brothers and sisters. In this love we fulfill God's law and plans. It is only through love that we can find our way to God.

December 30th 1 Jn 2:12-17

John writes today calling us to love God and not the world. If we love the world, it means the light of God does not dwell in us. He equates loving the world with things such as sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life. These things are not from God and must not be allowed to operate in our lives. The power of the world and sin is passing away through the grace of Jesus Christ. If we remain in the light of God, we will last forever. *Fr. Brian Johnson C.Ss.R.*

- Tucson Chapter; - Feed My Starving Children; - Diaper Bank of Southern Arizona.







Dear Padre,

The Bible talks about Jesus' brothers and sisters. Is there scriptural proof that Jesus was Mary's only child?

The Catholic Church's position is that Mary had only one child; her son called Jesus. Yet there are at least ten scriptural references to "the brothers of Jesus" or to his "sisters" (see Matthew 13:55-56, Mark 6:3, and Luke 8:19-21).

The difficulty is that the meaning of the term "brothers" (translated from the Greek *adelphos*) isn't restricted to the sharing of a parent. On the contrary, it may not only refer to other relatives, including cousins, but also to close relationships, such as disciples. This is not unlike how we might refer to "brothers in arms" as those who fought in a war together, or a religious order of brothers or sisters.

Recall, too, that Jesus and his disciples spoke Aramaic, and there is no equivalent for the meaning of "cousins" as we know it in that language. Instead, the word for brother or sister was used when referring to cousins. Thus, when St. Jerome (circa 340-420) translated the Bible from Hebrew into Church Latin, he considered "the brothers of Jesus" as cousins, not siblings. After all, it would have been the rightful responsibility of these male relatives of Jesus to take care of Mary when Jesus died. Yet Jesus entrusts his mother to the care of his beloved disciple John (John 19:26). •
