Our Lady of the Desert

December 3rd 1 COR 1:3-9

Paul writes to the Corinthians today. He praises them as people who have been called into fellow-ship with Jesus. God has given them all the gifts needed to achieve this fellowship. We too have been given all the graces needed to find fellowship with Christ and each other. Each one must simply exercise his or her own gifts, and we all will grow together in Christ's love. God's gifts to us are to be shared so that we can all benefit.

December 4th Is 2:1-5

Today's reading claims that God is calling all the world to himself through the ministry of Jerusalem. Of course, this prophecy is fulfilled in Christ. It is through his life, death, and resurrection that God will gather all the nations into one people. It is through him that peace can enter our world. Discord can never have the final word. Christ's love in us will always lead to peace.

December 5th Is 11:1-10

Isaiah prophesies peace and unity in the world. One of David's descendants will come forth as the eternal king. He will usher a time of peace and justice into our world. He will be marked by the Spirit of wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, and fear of the Lord. Notice that these gifts correspond to the gifts of the Spirit we received in Confirmation. Jesus's mission in the world today is carried out through you and me. He is counting on us to do our part in bringing love, peace, and redemption to our world.

December 6th Is 25:6-10a

Today, Isaiah prophesies a world of peace and comfort. All pain and fear will be removed from the earth. Death will no longer have power over us. Isaiah testifies that this vision will certainly come true. Of course, through Jesus, we know it has! He has conquered sin and death. In the life of resurrection, we will know nothing but peace!

December 7th Is 26:1-6

Isaiah prophesies today that Judah will find peace through God. He will bring the lowly people to an equal dignity with the powerful and rich. All will be one (similar to Jesus's promise that the last will be first and the first will be last.) All this will happen because God's love and mercy are a sure rock upon which our lives are built.

December 8th Eph 1:3-6, 11-12

The author sings a song of praise today. He rejoices in God's gift of salvation. He points out that we are blessed with all of the blessings and graces that God bestows upon His children because of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. This salvation was not something new in God's plan. It was there from the beginning. God's love has been with us the whole way, and it will be with us forever.

December 9th Is 30:19-21, 23-26

Isaiah today prophesies about our future with God. It will be a time of great joy and satisfaction. All our needs will be fulfilled for us. Peace shall blossom for everything in our world. We will live in the love and care of the Lord forever! Such is the future that awaits us!







Dear Padre,

Why are the Gospels Matthew and Mark so alike? Why did the Church keep both Gospels when so much of Mark seems to be a mirror image of Matthew?

The Gospels were written over time and used by the faithful when they gathered for worship. They read the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and accounts of the life and ministry of Jesus collected by Matthew, Mark, and Luke.

The Christian communities were often great distances from one another. A community may have had access to only one of these accounts. There is considerable similarity because the Gospel writers depended on one another. some of the same incidents. Each also has incidents or details unique to that Gospel.

These were not the only accounts written about the life and ministry of Jesus. At some point, the Church had to decide which should be considered the inspired word of God. There were four accounts that were widely used: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. With their similarities and differences, the Church accepted these four accounts as Gospel-the Good News.
