

Our Lady of the Desert

December 31st Col 3:12-21 or 3:12-17

In today's reading from The Letter to the Colossians, Paul uses a clothing metaphor. This is very common for Paul. He advices that we dress ourselves in "compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another." Paul sees Baptism as being a clothing with Christ for the Christian. We need to therefore live the values that Jesus lived. For today's feast of the Holy Family, he goes on in a similar way as he calls for peace and cooperation within the family unit. Paul asks wives to be "submissive" and calls husbands to "love". (We always need to remember that love involves putting of the needs of another first (submission).

January 1st Gal 4:4-7

Happy New Year! Paul today points out that God sent his son, born of a woman (Feast of Mary the Mother of God). By our union with the Son, (he became one of us in the incarnation,) we are made adopted children of God. Paul quickly points out that if we are children, we are heirs as well. We will inherit all the joys of heaven.

January 2nd 1 JN 2:22-28

John points out today that we have been made one with Christ and with the Father through our receiving of the Holy Spirit. He calls us all to be faithful to that union, to live as people united to God and each other. If we do, we will be ready to receive him when he appears again. Love is always the key!

January 3rd 1 JN 2:29-3:6

John encourages his readers to remain in Christ. He points out that sin separates us from Christ. We must never allow that to be our end. Rather, we need to trust in God's mercy and turn back to him in repentance. Then, we know we are still in Him!

January 4th 1 Jn 3:7-10

John calls people to act in righteousness. This involves treating one another with proper respect. It involves doing what is right and good for another person. If we are righteous, then we know we belong to God Who Himself is righteous. If we sin by not living righteously, we need to realize that we are no longer united with the Righteous One, and so repent!

January 5th 1 Jn 3:11-21

John writes today that we came to know love because God sent His Son who laid down his life for us. So, as children of God we too must love by laying down our lives for others. Thus, if we see a brother or sister in need, we must serve them. Love must show itself in deeds, not just in words.

January 6th 1 Jn 5:5-13

John writes that Jesus was God in the flesh. He points to the moment when Jesus was crucified and blood and water flowed out of his heart. Jesus was truly human, not God pretending to be human. Through Jesus, God gives us life. John writes, "God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever possesses the Son has life; whoever does not possess the Son of God does not have life." God offers us the life of Christ, we just need to accept it in faith. Then we will truly live!

Monday, we, of course, celebrate New Year's Day. It is also a very important feast day for our Catholic Church Community. We celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Mary is always held up by the Church as being her Son's most perfect Disciple. We honor her openness to God's will, her prayerfulness, her spirit of willing service to those around her. We also celebrate that Jesus gave her to us as an example and a mother. As we start off the new year, we do it with an intention of growing through God's grace into better images of his mother and Son. 










Novena Prayer to Our Mother of Perpetual Help adapted to be prayed in Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic

Dear Padre,

How much should we support our adult children? We have a niece and a daughter who are both healthy, capable, and in their twenties. We have set boundaries and continue to give to them but they just can't seem to get their act together. Would it be unchristian to cut them off?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes in detail the duties of family members toward each other (CCC 2214–33). Parents are responsible to ensure that their children grow up in faith and to



meet their basic needs. Children should show respect toward their parents and, as they grow older, assist them as needed. As children become adults, they should take on responsibility for themselves and parents are not to pressure them into choices of a profession or a spouse, while at the same time, "giving their children judicious advice...." (CCC 2230). At some point, children need to become responsible adults, which brings us to your point.

You seem to have done what is required as parents. At the same time, you would not want to abandon young adults if physical, mental, or emotional factors prevent them from assuming the responsibility of adulthood. If they are healthy, capable young people they should be able to progress in life without your financial assistance. To help them toward this goal, you may want to set very specific limits, perhaps with the help of a counselor, and then consistently follow those limits. •
