February 11th 1 Cor 10:31—11:1

Paul today points out that Jesus's life was all about service to others. Their needs were more important to him than his own. He states that he always tries to live this same way, even in the simpler things of life (such as eating). He advises the Corinthians to do likewise. They must always remember that they are called to serve and love others.

February 12th Jas 1:1-11

James first encourages his listeners to hold tight to their faith by persevering in all their trials. He goes on to encourage them to ask God for the gift of Wisdom. Wisdom can be defined as a knowledge about what is the best way to live in any given situation. James points out that God will be quick to answer one who asks in faith. We too should always pray for the gift of Wisdom!

February 13th Jas 1:12-18

James today writes about temptations. He encourages us to remain faithful even when tempted. Temptations are not sent from God to test our faith. Rather, James says that temptations come from our own desires. We must seek the help of God to overcome our desires for selfish gain.

February 14th 2 Cor 5:20—6:2

Today, we read from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians. Paul calls his listeners to repentance. He points out that God's response to sin was to send his Son to save us. If we repent, right now, we shall be forgiven and graced by God. Tomorrow might be too late! Paul encourages us that today is the acceptable time for us to repent! Now is the time of Salvation!

February 15th Dt 30:15-20

Moses points out that God has set before us a choice. We can either follow His laws or refuse to follow them. The choice is ours, and God will help us if we choose to be faithful. Such faithfulness will lead to life and blessing. Unfaithfulness will lead to death. As we saw yesterday, tomorrow may be too late for our choice. We must choose faithfulness today!

February 16th Is 58:1-9a

Isaiah writes today about sacrifice. God complains through Isaiah that the sacrifices of the people end in bitterness and violence. Sacrifice should end in love instead. We need to see our sacrifices as being a way in which we reach out in love and service to others. We refrain from thinking of ourselves and our wants in order to give to others. This is the mark of a true child of God.

February 17th Is 58:9b-14

God calls us today to refrain from oppression, from false accusations, and from malicious speech. He calls us to share with the poor and to take care of the afflicted among us. We are promised that if we do this, we will find blessing and life. Our willingness to forget our own wants will delight God. It will show that we are indeed his people. His rewards will be ours!

Pro-abortion Signature Campaign in Arizona

Millions of dollars from the pro-abortion industry are flooding into Arizona from out of State. This includes paying workers to collect signatures in front of grocery stores and other public locations for an amendment to our State Constitution.

We urge the citizens of Arizona not to sign or endorse this signature campaign.

The goal of the signature campaign is to enshrine a constitutional right to unrestricted abortion in Arizona. What makes a constitutional amendment especially grave is that our own Arizona Legislators could lose the ability to regulate abortion in any way, leaving us with the potential for fully unrestricted abortion.

The proposed amendment would put women and girls at risk by no longer requiring the use of a qualified medical doctor as well as by removing safety standards for abortion clinics. By eliminating current parental consent laws, mothers and fathers would be left out of decision-making when their minor daughter needs them the most. Too, the proposed amendment would allow for painful late-term abortions and open the door to taxpayer funding of them. While the effort claims to be moderate in nature, its vague language would make Arizona one of the most extreme states in terms of abortion. We believe that even many of those who support abortion in limited instances would find the proposed Constitutional amendment extreme and misleading.

Arizonans deserve far better than the measures being proposed in this signature campaign. We humbly ask for your prayers that this signature campaign will fail and that mothers and their babies will be kept alive and safe.

Again, we urge the citizens of Arizona not to sign when approached by these paid canvassers in front of stores or public locations.

Arizona Income Tax Credits

Donations to CTSO (The Catholic Tuition Support Organization) should be used as tax credits on your Arizona State income tax. If you owe, for example, \$1000 to the State you can redirect that \$1000 to a child whose sponsors are registered [members of the Our Lady of the Desert Church and who attend a catholic school in the diocese of Tucson](#). This will not cost you a dollar. It is a tax credit, not a tax deduction. This year the maximum deduction is \$2,609 for couples and \$1,307 for singles. You do not have to wait until April 15 so that you know how much money you owe to the state. You may estimate the amount based on last year's return. If you donate too much, you merely roll it over for next year's tax. But do not do this several years in a row so that you build up a big balance. If you donate now, then CTSO will send you a letter that you or your accountant can use to fill in the correct amounts on your 2023 Arizona tax forms 323 and 348. This scholarship fund is administered by the Knights of Columbus Council 15704 Referral # 1699 of Our Lady of the Desert Church. 
Dear Padre,

I am having a difficult time receiving Communion from a eucharistic minister who has been behaving in a manner that I don't consider moral. When I receive Communion from her, I feel like I am condoning her actions. Would it be wrong of me to go to a different person to receive Communion?

It seems unlikely that someone would assume you are condoning her actions by receiving Communion from her. We do not sin by receiving a sacrament from an unworthy person. What matters is how worthy we are to receive it. It might be wise to receive Communion from a different person if you are more concerned with this minister's behavior than you are with Jesus when you approach the sacrament.

It is not our task to expose and punish the sinner. If you look at the life of Jesus, you will see that he did everything possible not to condemn sinners but to save them. We should take that as the model for our own lives. Try to find ways to encourage her to live a good life. Perhaps friendship would serve her better than a boycott of her Communion line.

When Jesus was presented with the woman caught in adultery, he did not pretend that it was right. Neither did he rush to condemn her. He looked for his opportunity to forgive and tell her to avoid sin. Use that as your example about how to treat the woman at church. ●
