Weekend of February 17-18 First Sunday of Lent

We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



February 18th 1 Pt 3:18-22

Peter presents Jesus's crucifixion, death, and resurrection as a sacrificial offering through which all of humanity is set free from sin and separation from God for all eternity. Jesus's triumph was not just for the living, but also for those who had already died. The fruits of the death of Christ are applied to us in Baptism. Peter says that just as Noah and a few of his family escaped the waters of the flood in an ark, so we escape death by Baptism which gains for us a clear conscience.

February 19th Lv 19:1-2, 11-18

In today's reading from The Book of Leviticus, God calls out to the people that they (because they are created in his image) must be holy as he is holy. He therefore calls them to put all animosity out of their minds. They are to care for and serve their brothers and sisters in kindness. All selfishness must be cleansed from their hearts. This is also our call during Lent. We too need to concentrate on growing in holiness.

February 20th Is 55:10-11

Isaiah prophesies that God will send his Word to the earth and through that Word, God's Will shall be done. John's Gospel, of course, presents Jesus as the Word. So, in Jesus's life, death, and resurrection, God brings salvation to us as he always proclaimed he would in the Old Testament. Jesus will not return to the Father until the Father's will for salvation has been accomplished!

February 21st Jon 3:1-10

Today's reading from the Book of Jonah begins after Jonah has already been spewed onto the shore by the large fish. Jonah finally concedes and heads towards Nineveh. He begins to preach that Nineveh must repent of its evil, or God will destroy it. The king and all the people do indeed repent and so, God withholds punishment. The actions of the Ninevites, namely repentance, is held up to us this Lent so that we too may repent and encounter mercy.

February 22nd 1 Pt 5:1-4

Peter today calls upon all the presbyters of his day to treat their people with respect and kindness. They must not treat their people unkindly. We too, have been called by Christ to serve each other. This reading from Peter reminds us that this season of Lent is a time where we should also work on our kindness and goodness to others.

February 23rd Ez 18:21-28

Ezekiel prophesies that God judges us according to our actions at any moment. Our past has no bearing on today. It is what we do today that will determine our fate. If we turn from sin and strive to be holy, we will find life. For God, the present is everything. The choice we make today is what counts.

February 24th Dt 26:16-19

Moses reminds the people that they must always obey the laws and decrees of the Lord. We must choose Him to be our God by following his will in our lives. If we do, we will be greatly blessed and be special in His sight. Again, during Lent we too must seek to be better in following God's laws and decrees.

Arizona Income Tax Credits

Donations to CTSO (The Catholic Tuition Support Organization) should be used as tax credits on your Arizona State income tax. If you owe, for example, \$1000 to the State you can redirect that \$1000 to a child whose sponsors are registered <u>members of the Our Lady of the Desert Church and who attend a catholic school in the diocese of Tucson.</u> This will not cost you a dollar. It is a tax credit, not a tax deduction. This year the maximum deduction is \$2,609 for couples and \$1,307 for singles. You do not have to wait until April 15 so that you know how much money you owe to the state. You may estimate the amount based on last year's return. If you donate too much, you merely roll it over for next year's tax. But do not do this several years in a row so that you build up a big balance. If you donate now, then CTSO will send you a letter that you or your accountant can use to fill in the correct amounts on your 2023 Arizona tax forms 323 and 348. This scholarship fund is administered by the Knights of Columbus Council 15704 Referral # 1699 of Our Lady of the Desert Church. Lent

As you all know, we are now a few days into the Season of Lent. Lent is a time for us to take a hard look at our lives and see the areas where maybe our Christian beliefs don't shine forth in our life. It is a wonderful chance for us to start again. All are encouraged to pick a weak spot in our faith-life and work on making it stronger. We do this through a method that the Church encourages us to enter into, namely **fasting** (giving up something to remind ourselves that life is not about fulfilling our own wants), **prayer** (which reminds us that there is One Who is greater than ourselves and who is in charge), and **almsgiving** (sharing of our time treasure and talents with those around us as a way of reminding ourselves that we are called to serve, not be served). Using these disciplines well can help us grow as Christians.

We are also encouraged to make use of the sacrament of Penance during this season. To help with this, the parishes of our Vicariate will be holding Penance Services at the following times:

St Thomas the Apostle: March 5th at 5:30 P.M. St Elizabeth Ann Seton: March 7th at 6:00 P.M. St Odilia's: March 12th at 6:30 P.M. St Mark's: March 14th at 5:30 P.M. Santa Catalina: March 20th at 5:00 P.M. St Christopher's: March 20th at 6:00 P.M.

Our Lady of the Desert: March 23rd at 11:00 A.M.

Additional Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Dear Padre,

We're in the middle of home renovations, and the season of Lent is beginning. Everything is in total disarray. Any ideas to help me "keep my religion" at this time?

"There is...a time to tear down, and a time to build" (Ecclesiastes 3:1, 3). During the season of Lent-a word meaning "spring"-we are called to put away the "dead" deeds of winter. It's a time of spiritual "spring cleaning" for the individual and for the faith community. As nature renews herself every spring, so do we. The change of season may even prompt a renovation project-the kind you are now undertaking. The structural changes to a home afford many spiritual parallels-the redoing of your physical home can be a challenge to realign your spiritual home during Lent.

In the Genesis story, God is pleased with the handiwork of his creation. Likewise, our stamina, perseverance, and patience to see a work through to

its completion are cause for great satisfaction and celebration. This would remind us that we are made in the same image of God, who took delight in his own work. Lent also can become a time of delighting in ourselves as God's special and ongoing creation.

When your home improvement project is completed, arrange for a blessing of your home. Enthrone a special cross or icon to venerate, light a devotional candle, and use holy water in the area of the home that was improved. At that time, remind yourself again that you and your home belong to the Lord-renewed during the spring cleaning of Lent!
