

We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



February 25th Rom 8:31b-34

Paul writes today of Jesus's death. He points out that God loved us so much, that he was willing to have his Son die for the forgiveness of our sins. This fact shows Paul that "God is for us!" He points out that we need never fear. If God gave us the greatest gift He could give us (His Son) then how could he not give us all gifts that we need but which are less than the value of His Son? Finally, Paul closes this passage by stating that even now, Jesus is busy interceding for us. He intercedes that we might repent and return to God.

February 26th Dn 9:4b-10

Daniel declares in today's reading that God is always faithful in offering a covenant to his people. Even though we have sinned, the covenant is still offered. Compassion and forgiveness are always God's response to sin. If we turn from sin and become faithful to the commands of God, we will find forgiveness and peace. It is never God's will to punish, but to offer forgiveness. We just need to accept the forgiveness that is offered.

February 27th Is 1:10, 16-20

Isaiah prophesies that God is a God of mercy. God says through Isaiah, "Come now, let us set things right." He promises that if we turn our backs to sin and begin to do good, we will be forgiven. Faithfulness to God's way will bring about blessings. However, refusal to obey the way of the Lord will lead to judgement. The choice is ours!

February 28th Jer 18:18-20

Jeremiah cries out to the Lord today. He is being persecuted for speaking out against Israel. However, Jeremiah always insists that his job has been to intercede for the people with God. How can they be angry about this? In turning to God, Jeremiah presumedly finds peace. The same is true for us. If we turn toward God and away from our sins, we will find peace.

February 29th Jer 17:5-10

Jeremiah speaks in God's name today. He points out that trust in God is what leads to happiness and fulfillment. After all, God knows the human mind and heart since he created them. If we do what God calls us to do, we will find happiness and blessings. Following the ways of human thought will lead to darkness and despair. Our reward or punishment will be according to how we choose.

March 1st Gn 37:3-4, 12-13a, 17b-28a

Today we have the story of Joseph and his brothers. Joseph is loved by his father Jacob more than the rest of his children. They become envious of their father's love for Joseph. They allow this envy to sink deeper into their hearts. They decide the only way to deal with Joseph's favored-son

existence is to get rid of him. This story shows us what dangers can await us if we allow jealousy, anger, and other evil attitudes to remain in our hearts. They will lead to extremely evil actions! Lent is about purifying our hearts by asking God's grace to be with us. Then, we will not need to fear evil actions sprouting up in our lives.





March 2nd Mi 7:14-15, 18-20


Micah calls upon God as the shepherd of the people. He remembers how God shepherded the Israelites coming out of Egypt. He asks that God now again show care and mercy for his people even though they have strayed into sin. Micah is confident that God's mercy and love are always stronger than His desire to punish. In that love, Micah bids God to cast our sins into the sea and treat us with compassion. Asking for such mercy is really the whole reason for Lent.

In union with Christ's passion, we offer up as sacrifice upon the fleshy altars of our hearts all that we lack. In return we receive from on high the fullness of Christ's body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist, and we see the Word become flesh in our own lives.

Lent

As you all know, we are now a few days into the Season of Lent. Lent is a time for us to take a hard look at our lives and see the areas where maybe our Christian beliefs don't shine forth in our life. It is a wonderful chance for us to start again. All are encouraged to pick a weak spot in our faith-life and work on making it stronger. We do this through a method that the Church encourages us to enter into, namely **fasting** (giving up something to remind ourselves that life is not about fulfilling our own wants), **prayer** (which reminds us that there is One Who is greater than ourselves and who is in charge), and **almsgiving** (sharing of our time treasure and talents with those around us as a way of reminding ourselves that we are called to serve, not be served). Using these disciplines well can help us grow as Christians.

We are also encouraged to make use of the sacrament of Penance during this season. To help with this, the parishes of our Vicariate will be holding Penance Services at the following times:

St Thomas the Apostle: March 5th at 5:30 P.M. St Elizabeth Ann Seton: March 7th at 6:00 P.M. St Odilia's: March 12th at 6:30 P.M. St Mark's: March 14th at 5:30 P.M. Santa Catalina: March 20th at 5:00 P.M. St Christopher's: March 20th at 6:00 P.M. Our Lady of the Desert: March 23rd at 11:00 A.M.

Additional Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.




