February 4th 1 Cor 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul writes to the Corinthians about how he sees his ministry of preaching the gospel. For Paul, it is the other who matters, not himself. He preaches to all free of charge, even though he could charge if he wanted. He says he becomes all things to all people. He identifies with them where they are and calls them forth into the love of Jesus. His message is always intended to bring salvation to those who hear him.

February 5th 1 Kgs 8:1-7, 9-13

In today's reading, King Solomon has finished the building of the temple. He has the Ark of the Covenant brought in and placed in the Holy of Holies. Right away, God shows his presence through a dark cloud that fills the Holy of Holies. Israel now has a fitting home for their God. This brings to fulfillment God's Word to David that David's son would build him a house.

February 6th 1 Kgs 8:22-23, 27-30

Solomon prays today within the temple. He asks God's abiding presence to always be with Israel. He asks that God protect this temple always. As long as Solomon and the people remain faithful, God will answer their prayer. But, as they later depart into sin, the temple will fall. God protects those who are faithful to him.

February 7th 1 Kgs 10:1-10

The Queen of Sheba visits Solomon. She has heard of his amazing wisdom, wealth, and power, and she needs to see it for herself. God has indeed honored David's son just as He said he would do. The question now was the second part of the equation, where God said I will bless him if he remains faithful to me. Unfortunately, Solomon's great wealth and all his wives will turn him away from the Lord. Just like Solomon, we need to watch to make sure sin does not tempt us into ruin.

February 8th 1 Kgs 11:4-13

As Solomon grows old, he gives in to sin. He begins to build temples to the false gods of his wives. As his wives worship these false gods, God becomes angry. He announces that he will take the kingdom away from Solomon's son. He will be left with only one tribe who will follow him, because God remembers the promise He swore to David. Once again, sin has made a mess of all God's great plans for his people.

February 10th 1 kgs 11:29-32; 12:19

Today, the Northern Kingdom of Israel splits off from the Southern Kingdom of Judah. Kingship in the north is given to Jeroboam. David's house has lost most of the kingdom because his son was not faithful. Now, it is up to Jeroboam. Will he be faithful?

February 11th 1 Kgs 12:26-32; 13:33-34

Today we have our answer to the question of Jeroboam's faithfulness. The answer is no! He notices that many people from the north are going to shrines in Judah to offer sacrifice. He fears that if this keeps up, he will lose his people to the new King of Judah, Rehoboam. To stop these shrine visits, Jeroboam builds new shrines up north into which he places idols. He leads the people into sin and unfaithfulness. Once again, disaster will strike the people because of sin. *Fr. Brian Johnson C.Ss.R.*

Arizona Income Tax Credits

Donations to CTSO (The Catholic Tuition Support Organization) should be used as tax credits on your Arizona State income tax. If you owe, for example, \$1000 to the State you can redirect that \$1000 to a child whose sponsors are registered members of the Our Lady of the Desert Church and who attend a catholic school in the diocese of Tucson. This will not cost you a dollar. It is a tax credit, not a tax deduction. This year the maximum deduction is \$2,609 for couples and \$1,307 for singles. You do not have to wait until April 15 so that you know how much money you owe to the state. You may estimate the amount based on last year's return. If you donate too much, you merely roll it over for next year's tax. But do not do this several years in a row so that you build up a big balance. If you donate now, then CTSO will send you a letter that you or your accountant can use to fill in the correct amounts on your 2023 Arizona tax forms 323 and 348 Please, after #348 add: IMPORTANT forms are in back of Church to donate, with our referral # 1699 filled in.. This scholarship fund is administered by the Knights of Columbus Council 15704 of Our Lady of the Desert Church. Dear Padre,

In the Our Father, we pray, "thy kingdom come." Will God's kingdom come only at the end of the world?

God's kingdom will come in its fullness only at Jesus' Second Coming, but the kingdom came into the world with Jesus' first coming as a man. That means we are in God's kingdom right now, but not in its fullness.

In the Scriptures, we read that John sends his disciples to ask Jesus if he is the messiah or if they need to wait for another. Jesus responds, "The blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" (Luke 7:22). These are all signs of the kingdom of God.



In the meantime, we don't have to just wait for God's kingdom to come in its fullness. We can make God's kingdom more of a reality on earth by visiting the sick, caring for the poor, and being kind to others. Loving your spouse is a sign of the kingdom of God. God's kingdom is among us, not completely but partially, and we can make it more of a reality in the good that we do for each other.

Jesus' Second Coming will be at the end of time, an event Jesus himself did not know the time of: "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Mark 13:32).
