Caster Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

March 31st Col 3:1-4

Happy Easter! Paul appeals to the people to remember who they are. Their Baptism changed them. They lived now in Christ. He calls them to keep their minds on heaven, not on the things of this earth. We have died with Christ to this world. He promises that one day Christ will return and raise us up to new life and glory. We simply need to remain faithful.

April 1st Acts 2:14, 22-33

Peter today speaks of Jesus's death and resurrection. Using a quote from Psalm 16 in which David writes about a figure who will die and yet live, Peter points out that David could not have been speaking about himself. After all, David died and his grave was in their midst even at Peter's time. Therefore, what was written in Ps 16 is a prophecy about the Redeemer, Jesus. Peter thus shows that the resurrection was always part of God's plan.

April 2nd Acts 2:36-41

Peter declares that Jesus is both Lord (God) and Christ (The Anointed One of God, i.e. the Messiah). He calls upon the people of his day to repent of their sins and be Baptized. In Baptism they will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This Spirit will lead them to life. We too need to hear Peter's recommendation today. The Spirit gives us the power to turn from sin and find Life with God. We need only allow the Spirit to live in and through us!

April 3rd Acts 3:1-10

Peter and John perform a miracle today. The power of Jesus working through them allows them to heal a man who was lame. Through Jesus, this man received a new life. So too, Peter proclaims that Jesus will raise the people from death to life. The power of Jesus has begun a new age of wholeness and life for us!

April 4th Acts 3:11-26

Peter explains to the people that it was in the name and power of Jesus that the lame man was healed. He announces that the time of restoration has come. He calls people to repent of sin and turn to God. God will in turn pour out the Spirit of his Son, the Messiah, on the people. New and restored life is a gift God intends for all people. Through living a life of faith, we open ourselves to this gift.

April 5th Acts 4:1-12

The Religious Authorities are angered because Peter and John are proclaiming that Jesus is alive. So, the two are arrested and questioned. Fearlessly, Peter tells the officials that the man Jesus, whom they had killed, was now risen by the power of God. It is by his power that Peter and John have healed the lame man. Peter proclaims that Jesus is the only name through which we can be saved. He calls the officials to repentance.

April 6th Acts 4:13-21

The officials know that Peter's words are backed up by the miracle that was worked. All the people have seen this event. Peter and John are warned to never again speak in the name of Jesus. Peter tells them they cannot stop speaking of the things they have witnessed in Jesus. Because of their fear of the people, the officials release them. Once again, we see God protecting those He has chosen. ~Fr. Brian Johnson C.Ss.R.




Sometimes we look back over our lives and wonder why we never experienced the love or fulfillment we dreamed about when we were children.

All single men from 18-40 years old are invited to "Come and Pray" as they learn about the Redemptorist way of life.



Dear Padre,

Where did the idea of an Easter bunny come from? What about the Easter egg?

The Easter bunny is really a hare which, according to an Egyptian legend, is a symbol of the moon. Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs after the twenty-first day of March. Put this together, and we have an Easter bunny.



Early Christians gave new meaning to the Roman proverb *Omne vivum ex ovo*, which means, "All life comes from an egg." A hatching chick represented the risen Christ emerging from the shell of a tomb on Easter morning. Consequently, eggs were prohibited during the Lenten fast and were reintroduced at the Easter meal and also shared as decorated gifts. In 1610, a prayer by Pope Paul V blessed the egg "that it may become a wholesome sustenance to Thy faithful servants, eating in thankfulness to Thee, on account of the Resurrection of Our Lord."

In some parts of the world, children carry baskets and torches and sing Easter carols as they go from place to place. They are given brightly colored eggs to put in their baskets. In other places, eggs are carried to church and blessed by the priests. The eggs are taken home and placed in the center of the table as the main dish at the Easter feast. Visitors to the house during Easter week are offered this sacred food of the resurrection. Happy Easter!
