

Weekend of April 20-21 Fourth Sunday of Easter



Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



April 21st 1 Jn 3:1-2

John writes to a people who have known great persecution in their lives. John tells them that such persecution should be expected, because, after all, Jesus himself was found unacceptable to the leaders and therefore persecuted. John bids them, and us, when we feel persecuted for the faith, to hold on in hope. One day it will be all worth it when we see God face to face in his kingdom.

April 22nd Acts 11:1-18

One of the biggest obstacles to the Faith in the early days was the conversion of Gentiles. The Jews always hung their prestige on the fact that they were the chosen people of God. Therefore, they believed that if a Gentile wished to follow Christ, that person should become a Jew first. Peter, however, shares a vision he had received about this idea. He learned through this experience that God accepted the Gentiles as Gentiles! The Jewish people were God's chosen ones not as an exception, but rather they were called first so that they in turn could call unbelievers to join them in the kingdom. They were chosen as instruments of universal salvation!

April 23rd Acts 11:19-26

Today, we see that persecution in Jerusalem has driven many Christians into other parts of Israel and the surrounding area. They share the word about Jesus being the Messiah as they go. The Apostles in Jerusalem hear of this and send Barnabas to see what is happening. His report sends waves of joy over the Apostles. Barnabas then finds Paul, and the two of them work at teaching and forming the new Christian community in Antioch. Once again, we see that God is working through pain and struggle to bring His love more fully into our world.

April 24th Acts 12:24-13:5a

Antioch became a great center of early Christianity. Paul, Barnabas, and several others have labored to found the Christian Faith there. Now, the Holy Spirit tells Paul and Barnabas that they must go out and spread the Faith throughout the wider area. So, the great Missionary career of Paul begins. He will go out to teach and serve the people of many nations.

April 25th 1 Pt 5:5b-14

Peter today begs the Christian Community to be humble. After all, they are to see themselves as servants of one another. Pride, where they think they are better than others, or that others should serve them, is a temptation of the devil that must be avoided. If we stay true to Jesus's word, we will be exalted in heaven.

April 26th Acts 13:26-33

Paul preaches the resurrection of Jesus today in the first of the cities he will visit. He points out that through the rejection of Jesus by the Jewish Leaders, salvation came into the world. It was all part of God's plan. Had Jesus not died, there would be no resurrection at work in the world.

April 27th Acts 13:44-52

Paul and Barnabas have shared the message of the Gospel with the people of the city. The Jewish leaders there oppose them. So, Paul and Barnabas announce that they will now turn to the Gentiles. And so, the great work of calling Gentiles to Christ begins. This makes the Gentiles rejoice, but it pushes the Jewish leaders to persecute the Faith. So, Paul and Barnabas head elsewhere to proclaim the Gospel.




Liguorian Article

Contemplative Intensive Retreat with Fr. Stephen Rehrauer, CSsR

April 26-28, 2024

Jesus taught that the Kingdom of God is within and among us. This Good News lives first and foremost at the very center of our being. To truly follow Christ from the depths of our lives we must seek "within" through quiet prayerful meditation and listen to his Spirit speaking there. Following Jesus Christ is not only a matter of doing; it is a way of being.

The intensive retreat is an opportunity for those new to contemplative prayer to begin a regular practice of Christian meditation. For those already practicing contemplative prayer, it affords an opportunity to deepen their practice and renew their commitment to this powerful prayer form. The retreat includes instruction and intensive practice of the form of meditation known as 'Christian mindfulness', or 'Centering Prayer.' We will learn the importance of body posture in prayer, of emptying the mind of thoughts and distractions, and other concentration techniques to attain a state of openness to the voice of God's Spirit speaking to our spirits and teaching us to pray. In clearing the ground of our lives through Christian contemplation, the seed of God's Kingdom sown there can flourish and produce a hundred-fold.



Dear Padre,

My son was raised Catholic and still claims he is Catholic, but he and his wife go to a Protestant church. How should I deal with my frustration?

Many parents and grandparents today share your frustration. They raised their children Catholic, maybe even sent them to Catholic schools, but the children have grown up and chosen not to continue to be faithful Catholics. A recent survey showed that nine out of ten people say they believe in God, but often they are not committed to a single religion or house of worship. About



half of the people questioned attend religious services less than once a month, or never. The loyalty to one Church that was evident in our own lives, or in our parents' and grandparents' lives, is lacking in today's people under age fifty-five.

What can one do about this situation? Certainly pray for your children and continue to give a good example through your own loyalty to the Catholic Church and attendance at Sunday Mass. Invite your son and his wife to attend with you when they visit. As your children age, they may become more interested in your family's history and traditions, and the religion of their childhood may again appear attractive. Try to be patient and continue to pray that your children will return to the Church of their roots.
