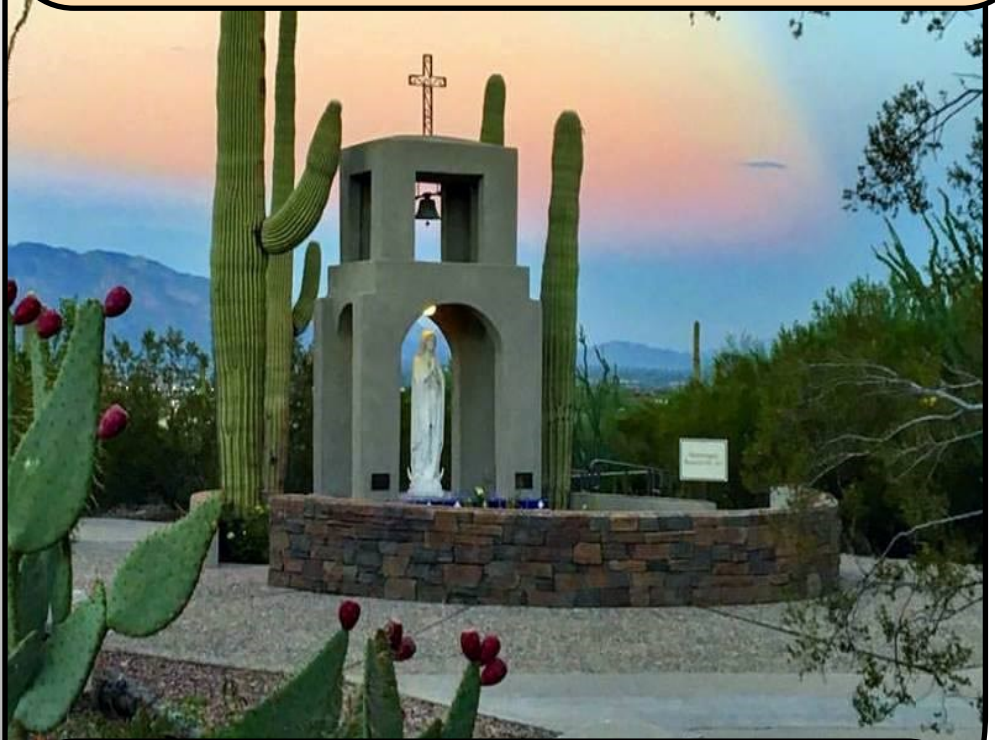

Our Lady of the Desert



April 28th 1 Jn 3:18-24

John writes today that we have been given a commandment by God: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. John insists that such love is not a matter of words, but of putting those words into action. If we truly do deeds of love, we know we are obeying God's commands.

April 29th Acts 14:5-18

Paul and Barnabas are forced to leave Iconium because of another persecution against them. They arrive in Lystra and preach to the people there. Paul notices a crippled man and sees that he has faith. Paul heals him. As a result, these Gentiles believe Paul and Barnabas to be gods. Paul and Barnabas try to correct them but have no luck in doing so.

April 30th Acts 14:19-28

Once again, persecution catches up to Paul and he is stoned. So, Paul and Barnabas once again leave for a new town. They win many converts there. They return to all the cities they had visited and put presbyters in charge of each community and encouraged the people to continue in the faith. Even the fact that they were persecuted in these cities could not keep them away. Finally, they end up back in Antioch where they first started their mission. The Church there rejoices to hear of the success they had.

May 1st Acts 15:1-6

Paul and Barnabas run into a familiar problem today. Some Christians are of the opinion that Gentiles must become Jews and be circumcised before they can be Christians. Paul and Barnabas go to Jerusalem to consult the Apostles about this question. We see here that the Church throughout the world viewed the Apostles as the true authority, just as we view the bishops today.

May 2nd Acts 15:7-21

Peter speaks today at the gathering of the Jerusalem Church. He points out that God has called Gentiles to the Church and has shared the gift of the Holy Spirit with them. If God treats them this way, why should the Church put up obstacles? James agrees and sends word back to the Gentiles that they need not be circumcised. However, they should obey some of the basic Jewish laws. God's Church is declared as being for all people, Jew, and Gentile alike!

May 3rd 1 Cor 15:1-8

Paul writes the Corinthians about the death and resurrection of Jesus. He tells them that if they hold fast to what he told them in Faith, they are assured of salvation. The apostles, and Paul himself, are eyewitnesses for us of the truth of the resurrection. We can trust that what they have told us is real.

May 4th Acts 16:1-10

Paul now teams up with Timothy to continue his missionary trips. They are presented as being directed where to go by the Holy Spirit. Paul in a dream receives a call to go to Macedonia, a town in Europe. This is the first entrance of Christianity into Europe. It will spread there as it had in the Middle East. God's message continues to spread across the face of the earth!

had trusted myself...

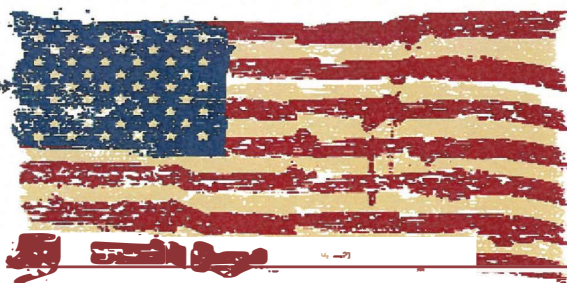
Regrets haunt us from time to time.

So, on Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup>, after the 10 AM Mass, the Knights of Columbus, Fourth Degree, Father Anthony Rey Assembly No. 3617, will perform an informative Flag Retirement Ceremony. Chairs will be set up between the Church and Mary's Garden for anyone who wants to watch the Ceremony. The Ceremony will explain the history of the American Flag and the steps of the Retirement Ceremony.

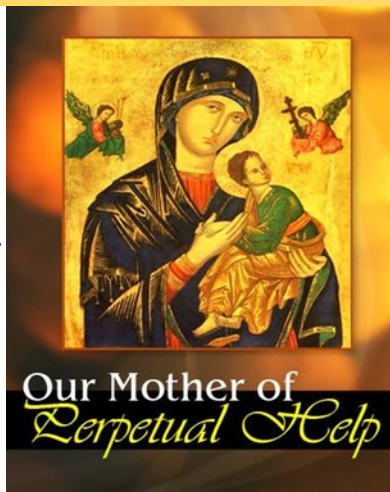

# Dear Padre,

***Several months ago my son died in a tragic car accident. Life, work, family, and even religion seem so meaningless now. How can I find my way back?***

You have suffered a great loss. When you are able, you can choose to live in a way that will respect both your son's memory and your own ongoing life. Here are a few gentle steps that might help.

- Expect to feel numb at first. This is nature's way of helping you deal with your loss. Keep following the normal patterns of your life and, eventually, meaning will return.
- Allow your friends to help. "Sorrows shared are sorrows lessened."
- If you are sad, let the tears come! Even Jesus cried at the death of his friend Lazarus (John 11:32–35).
- If you are angry, look for a healthy release. Focus the energy of your anger into productive work, even if it's just doing dishes or yard work.
- Use your experience to help others. While helping others, the Lord often reveals to us the meaning of our own losses.
- Don't be afraid to seek professional help. A therapist has the expertise to help you talk about your loss and cope with your grief.
- Pray for yourself, for your son, for all whose lives he touched, for all those who are grieving.
- After you have done everything you can, leave your loss in God's hands. The Lord will do for you what you cannot do for yourself. ●
