

Our Lady of the Desert

May 5th 1 Jn 4:7-10

John points out today what real love is. Often, we think it is when we have feelings of affection for someone. However, John says that true love is this: God has sent his Son to die so that we might have life through him. Any love we practice is done in and through this true love.

May 6th Acts 16:11-15

In today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we see that the early Church is growing and changing. We see Christians and Greeks (pagans) actually meeting together. We also see male and female gather. All the divisions from the past seem to be overcome. The resurrection of Jesus has united the Church as one.

May 7th Acts 16:22-34

Paul and his mission companion, Silas, are arrested and thrown into prison. In spite of this, they continue to sing songs of praise to God. Their faith is not shaken by the suffering they must endure. Later that night, God frees them from their shackles through an earthquake that sets them free. Yet, even now Paul and Silas do not leave, for they know the jailer, shamed because of his failure to guard them, will attempt to kill himself if he finds them missing. Instead, their continued presence in an unlocked cell wins a new convert for the Church.

May 8th Acts 17:15, 22—18:1

Paul preaches today in the famous Areopagus in Athens. When the people hear him speak about the resurrection, most of them mock him and refuse to listen any further. However, there are several influential people who do become followers of Jesus. Paul gives an example of how we must keep bearing witness to Jesus even when others seem to reject our message. As Jesus said in the gospel (parable of the sower), we just need to sow the word and let God do the rest.

May 9th Acts 18:1-8

Paul leaves Athens and goes to Corinth. The Jewish people living there oppose his teaching about Jesus. So, now Paul announces that he will begin to go preach to the gentiles. Right away, we see that Paul's teaching attracts Gentile converts into the Church.

May 10th Acts 18:9-18

Paul's hard work continues. He stays in Corinth for a year and a half. When a new Roman over-seer is named to the area, the Jewish citizens of Corinth have Paul arrested and taken before that over-seer, accusing Paul of subverting the people. Gallio could care less about Jewish religious matters, so he refuses to deal with Paul. Eventually, Paul once again takes off down the road to preach elsewhere.

May 11th Acts 18:23-28

Today we meet Apollos. He is a believer who comes preaching about Jesus. Two of Paul's disciples give Apollos a little information about the faith that he seemed unfamiliar with. Apollos goes on to be a very effective preacher of the good news. Jesus is continuing to call workers into the vineyard of the Church. New life flourishes when we all work together!

If only I had trusted you... If only I had trusted myself...


Regrets haunt us from time to time.

Dear Padre,

Please clarify for me what the Church considers as "gossip." Is it that bad?

Human beings have the great gift of speech. We continually talk to one another and we talk about one another. Gossip, at its most basic level, is just idle talk. It is neither good nor bad. But it is a tool we can use to build up another human being or tear a person down.

Gossip is sinful when we use our words to unjustly hurt the reputation of another or to judge another person rashly. The two



To judge whether your own gossip is good or evil, simply ask yourself: Do the words I am saying help others or hurt others? Am I building them up or tearing them down? Hopefully, as a Christian, you are committed to the commandment of Jesus we hear in today's Gospel: "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you" (John 15:12).
