


We have looked at the first two of the Sacraments of Initiation. We now turn to the third of these Sacraments, namely the Sacrament of Eucharist. As members of Christ's body, the church, Eucharist offers us the continual renewal and strengthening that we need to live the life of a Christian. We gather together as a family with God and our neighbor to celebrate the unity we share, and the life of Jesus that we share. The Eucharist is a multifaceted reality. We must view it from several different viewpoints to see all its various meanings. It is only when these various aspects of the Eucharist are understood and brought together that we can see the full meaning of this Sacrament. A story might show us what I am referring to. There is a story of a group of blind people living in the middle of a jungle. They hear from some passers-by that an elephant has moved into the jungle. These men have no idea what an elephant is, so they send representatives out to investigate. One blind man, who when he met the elephant put out his hands and touched an ear, comes back and tells the others that an elephant is like a fan. Another person touches the elephant's leg and reports back that an elephant is like a big strong pillar. Another touches the tail, and says that no, the elephant is like a rope. Other blind people touch other parts of the elephant and give entirely different descriptions of an elephant. Obviously, each of these blind folks were partly correct. There were parts of the elephant that did conform to their descriptions. However, none of them contained the whole truth of what an elephant is. To get at that, we need to put all the various aspects together to have any true idea of what an elephant is really like. The same holds true for the Eucharist. We need to look at it under various aspects to arrive at a fuller understanding of what it is. The Eucharist is extremely rich in its meaning!

Cry for Help

Most people I know have difficulty asking for help. It makes no difference whether they need help with a project at work, or if they need help because their lives are falling apart, they hold it in and keep their pain all to themselves.

In public, these people wear a mask that says "life is good." But the mask actually hides the fact that life is anything but good for them. Over the years, they have become masters of exuding happiness to hide their misery.

They aren't always social because they need to islote long enough to recharge their "fake happiness" batteries. Hiding the truth also makes their relationships more difficult. So, they tend to stay on the superficial level. Letting others get to close might lead to the other seeing flaws in their stealth armor.

All of this need to be outwardly strong while suffering from inner burdens eventually leads to spiritual, mental, emotional and physical burn-out. A person can only pretend for so long. At some point they are going to have to surrender their independence and perfectionism to God through a cry for help.

And eventually, they are going to have to share their cry for help withjpeople in their lives that they know they can open-up to and trust to help them.

If you are wearing a mask to hide your inner-poin, now is the time to learn to remove it, cry for help and receive the relief that you need-- the relief that can only be attained through the assistance of God and others.





Dear Padre,

I miss the use of incense. Is it forbidden or out of style?

Incense is not out of style, nor is it forbidden. It is still burned to signify that Christ's sacrifice ascends to God as an odor of sweetness and as a sign of people's prayers rising to the throne of God. In the Book of Revelation, we read: "Another angel came and stood at the altar, holding a gold censer. He was given a great quantity of incense to offer, along with the prayers of all the holy ones, on the gold altar that was before the throne. The smoke of the incense along with the prayers of the holy ones went up before God from the hand of the angel" (Revelation 8:3-4).



Incense is a resinous substance obtained by cutting into the bark of a fir or pine tree. The original meaning of the Hebrew word for incense was "fragrant smoke." Ancient Jews burned incense as an act of worship in the tabernacle and temple. Scripture mentions incense often (Ephesians 5:2 and Philippians 4:18, for instance).

Today, incense is often used at the benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, at funerals, and during other special liturgical celebrations to highlight the festivity of a particular occasion. Celebrants may also use incense in any liturgy to bless the congregation, the altar, the book of the Gospels, and the gifts of bread and wine. The Redemptorists / DearPadre.org
