

Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.

Our Lady of the Desert

We continue to explore the Last Supper as a Passover meal. Jesus and his disciples are celebrating the love of God for them and His choice of them as his people. However, Jesus departs from the ordinary Passover ritual. He takes bread and says, "This is my body." He takes the cup and says, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." This change in ritual must have confused the Disciples. Eventually, they realize what Jesus was saying. By referring to the bread and wine as his body and blood, Jesus was actually setting up a new memorial for them based on Passover. The next day, Jesus would offer his life on the cross to save them from sin. The Eucharist was the "fruit" of the crucifixion. Just as the Israelites ate the flesh of the Passover Lamb and spread its blood on their doorposts, now Jesus was telling them to eat his body which will be sacrificed for them and to drink the blood which will be poured out for them. Jesus wants them and us to understand that the crucifixion was for us. The eating of the sacrificed flesh and drinking of the blood poured out shows this. The early Church always saw the Eucharist, therefore, as the New Passover. Since it is a memorial, the Church teaches that when we celebrate mass and receive the Eucharist, we are right there at the foot of the cross, receiving the grace of salvation which flows from Jesus' crucifixion! As we celebrate the Eucharist, we are united even more deeply with Jesus as he shares his resurrection life with us. In the Eucharist, God chooses us, and we celebrate God's choosing us and freeing us from slavery to sin and death!







Dear Padre,

A friend claims that various saints have appeared to her. Is this something that really happens?

Your friend might be experiencing what are called "private" revelations. Many recognized saints experienced visions in which Jesus, Mary, or the disciples spoke to them. These revelations were sometimes the sparks that caused future saints to leave whatever they were doing and follow Jesus in a dynamic way.

Saint Francis of Assisi was a rich young man who had a vision of Christ that radically changed his life. After this private revelation, Francis embraced poverty and devoted himself to the care of the sick. He founded the Franciscans to carry on his mission. An example of recent private revelations are the apparitions at Medjugorje. Even though the Church has not formally recognized these revelations, many have discovered a deeper faith because of them.



The Catechism of the Catholic Church says this about private revelations: "Throughout the ages, there have been so-called "private" revelations, some of which have been recognized by the authority of the Church. They do not belong, however, to the deposit of faith. It is not their role to improve or complete Christ's definitive Revelation, but to help live more fully by it in a certain period of history" (CCC 67).

It is important to note whether the private revelation is contrary to the faith or the morals of the Church, and whether a particular revelation brings one closer to God.
