# The Baptism of the Lord



Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.

## Our Lady of the Desert

The Sacrament of Hoy Orders results in the existence of three different offices in the Church Community, namely Bishops, Priests, and Deacons. We now look a little closer at these three offices.

The Bishop receives the fullness of the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Through his ordination he becomes a successor to the Apostles. As a bishop, a man becomes the recognized visible head or pastor of the local Church entrusted to his care. In his fullness of priesthood, the bishop is tasked by Christ with the fulfillment of all the ministerial deeds of the Church. He is empowered to celebrate all seven of the sacraments. He is the chief minister of the Word of God in his diocese. He is in charge of the priests and deacons who assist him in his ministry.

By ordination, "Priests are united with the bishops in (priestly) dignity and at the same time depend on them in the exercise of their pastoral functions; they are called to be the bishops' prudent co-workers (CCC # 1595). The bishop appoints priests to parishes or other special ministries. They receive faculties for functioning as priests from the bishop. Priests assist bishops by leadership in the smaller parish communities of the diocese. They share in the tasks of celebrating the liturgy, preaching the Gospels, and celebrating most of the sacraments (Holy Orders and Confirmation are reserved to the bishop, although in certain circumstances, priests can receive delegation to Confirm).





Shame is the most devastating and deadly of all feelings. It can literally devour a person from within because shame is all about "I am inherently bad or defective" and there's no way I can change who I am.

Shame is different from guilt. Guilt is solely about behavior and we can always change our behavior. We can take responsibility for it, make amends and learn new healthier patterns of behavior.

But shame is about who we are. It's about the color of our skin, or our gender, or our sexual orientation, or our physical body or our mental abilities. It's about the things we cannot change and must learn to accept and love.

Internalized shame leads to depression and addictive patterns of behavior as it destroys a person's self-love, self-esteem and self-worth.



### Dear Padre,

We are told that we are baptized into Jesus' death and resurrection, and that baptism is necessary for our salvation. But why was Jesus baptized?

Jesus was baptized, not because he needed saving, but so that others might be saved. By accepting baptism, he established this act as the normative path for salvation. Saint John Chrysostom addressed this question: "Though [Christ] needed not baptism for his own sake, yet carnal nature in others had need thereof." Or as St. Gregory

Nazianzen said more poetically: "Christ was baptized that he might plunge the old Adam entirely in the water."

Another reason Jesus accepted baptism is suggested by St. Augustine. He said our Lord was baptized "because he wished to do what he had commanded all to do." This is true servant leadership—not asking of others what one is not willing to do oneself. Or as St. Ambrose said, "This is justice, to do first thyself that which thou wishest another to do, and so encourage others by thy example."

Perhaps as we launch into a new year, we might try to remember our baptismal promise to "put on Christ" and imitate Jesus in this way: to not ask of anyone—our children or parents; employers or employees; teachers or students; principals or pastors; or even presidents—what we do not ask of ourselves, especially when it comes to honesty, dedication, civility, and charity.
