

Our Lady of the Desert

The title "deacon" comes from the Greek word diakonia meaning service. The deacon is responsible to the bishop and to his pastor in carrying out acts of service within the community. Deacons receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders from the hand of the bishop. However, they are ordained not to the ministerial priesthood, but to the ministry of service. Just as Jesus came to serve and not to be served, so the deacon works in service to the needs of the Church and of the bishop and pastor. In the Latin Church, deacons serve by baptizing the faithful, reading the Gospel at liturgies, preaching the Word of God, witnessing marriages, and in leading funeral services outside of mass. The deacon is also dedicated to other charitable endeavors within the church community.

Deacons are strengthened for their ministry through the imposition of hands that has come down from the apostles. The grace of the sacrament helps them to enter into their ministry and be fruitful servants of Christ and the Church.

All priests are ordained deacons before they are ordained priests. Therefore, priests also share in the service duties of the Church. Those deacons who go on to be ordained priests are called transitional deacons. There does exist in the Latin Church, however, a permanent diaconate. A permanent deacon may be married or unmarried.



Shame is the most devastating and deadly of all feelings. It can literally devour a person from within because shame is all about "I am inherently bad or defective" and there's no way I can change who I am.

Shame is different from guilt. Guilt is solely about behavior and we can always change our behavior. We can take responsibility for it, make amends and learn new healthier patterns of behavior.

But shame is about who we are. It's about the color of our skin, or our gender, or our sexual orientation, or our physical body or our mental abilities. It's about the things we cannot change and must learn to accept and love.

Internalized shame leads to depression and addictive patterns of behavior as it destroys a person's self-love, self-esteem and self-worth.






Dear Padre,

Is there a year of John? I know we're now in the year of Luke, next year will be the year of Matthew, and the following year will be the year of Mark. Then the cycle starts over with Luke. Why doesn't John have a year?

Matthew, Mark, and Luke, collectively known as the synoptic gospels, are narrative gospels. Together, they tell the story of Jesus of Nazareth. Although in some ways they might be understood synoptically, "the same," each narrative is unique in its emphasis. The Church desires that we hear these narratives and be nourished through the proclamation of the early memories of the Christian community.

John's Gospel, on the other hand, is not primarily a narrative, but is best understood as theological. As such, it is highly dependent on the use of symbolic representations to make the point it intends. For example, "I am the light of the world.



Whoever follows me...will have the light of life" (John 8:12). The interplay between light and darkness illustrates the point. John's Gospel is intended to be experienced and engaged in as "bigger than life," proposing and celebrating Christian themes that are life-giving and inviting. Therefore, we hear John's Gospel when the Church celebrates the mystery of the saving life and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, the Gospel of John is proclaimed on Good Friday, during the Easter season, and on other major feasts. •
