Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. Our Lady of the Desert

The Church uses the term "order" for this sacrament. This term was used in the Roman Empire to refer to a governing group. In this sacrament, there are three orders: Bishops, Priests, and Deacons. All three involve a special sharing in the Holy Spirit. As the Catechism says, ordination "confers a gift of the Holy Spirit that permits the exercise of a Sacred Power... which can come only from Christ Himself through the Church" (CCC #1538).

From Old Testament times on, God has been active in the life of his people through priests. It is through priests like Melchizedek, Aaron and his sons, and through the Tribe of Levi, that God brought his saving mercy to his people. These priests offered sacrifices to God on behalf of the people. They proclaimed the word of God to the people so they could grow in their communion with God. However, they could not provide the fullness of salvation to their people. For this, Jesus was needed.

Jesus offered the sacrifice of himself upon the cross in a priestly act of perfect self-offering accepted by the Father and culminating in His resurrection from the dead. As Risen Lord and High Priest, he continues to offer salvation to all.

Jesus has called certain men to join him in his priesthood through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. To build up this priesthood, Christ gives to his Church the ordained ministries of Bishop, Priest, and Deacon. As the Catechism states, "Through the ordained ministry, especially that of bishops and priests, the presence of Christ as head of the Church is made visible in the midst of the Community of Believers" (CCC # 1549). This Sacrament does not preserve these ordained men from weakness and sin, but the Holy Spirit guarantees that the minister's sin does not impede the effectiveness of the Sacrament and its graces. In fact, the Catechism insists that the sacrament and its graces calls the ordained to a holiness of life and an attitude of humility that conforms them to Christ whose priesthood they share. So, the ordained minister always acts in the person of Christ and in the name of the Church.





Dear Padre,

I'm into horoscopes. A friend told me that astrology is nonsense and against the Catholic faith. What do you say?

Stargazing is as old as the human race. We know with certainty that ancient Chaldea was known for its stargazers. Many of the constellations' names originated during that time. Some scholars believe that the three



wise men who came from the East to pay homage to the newborn Savior were themselves Chaldean stargazers.

Astrologers believe that the zodiac signs under which we were born largely control our human destiny. The Christian objection to astrology is that it insults almighty God, who alone knows the future. God alone, in cooperation with the free will of humans, controls the future. To suppose that stars, planets, animals, or inanimate objects can, independent of God, direct or influence our lives opposes the first commandment: "I am the LORD your God.... You shall not have other gods beside me" (Exodus 20:2–3).

The Old Testament clearly spells out that it is vain to imagine "either fire, or wind, or the swift air, or the circuit of the stars, or the mighty water, or the luminaries of heaven" as "the governors of the world" (Wisdom 13:2).

Don't give credit to or blame the stars for what you do and who you are. See past them to the God who made them, and who made us, and who cares for all creation.
