

Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. In the Sacrament of Marriage, the Church sees a man and a woman entering into a covenant with each other. As one of the blessings for the Marriage Rite says, "Father, you have made the union of husband and wife so holy a mystery that it symbolizes the marriage of Christ and His Church." Shame is the most devastating and deadly of all feelings. It can literally devour a person from within because shame is all about "I am inherently bad or defective" and there's no way I can change who I am.

Shame is different from guilt. Guilt is solely about behavior and we can always change our behavior. We can take responsibility for it, make amends and learn new healthier patterns of behavior.

But shame is about who we are. It's about the color of our skin, or our gender, or our sexual orientation, or our physical body or our mental abilities. It's about the things we cannot change and must learn to accept and love.

Internalized shame leads to depression and addictive patterns of behavior as it destroys a person's self-love, self-esteem and self-worth.

This retreat will focus on identifying areas of shame in our lives, facing them and taking our power back from them.

The Root of Addiction

How Addiction Begins. How Serenity Begins

Although there is no cure for addiction, it can be managed. Taming the addictive personality requires living 12 Step spirituality, relying on a Higher Power and the determination to take back control of your life.

The addictive personality develops in childhood for most people. And it's fueled by the belief that we are "not good enough" to be loved-- by our family, God or anyone else.

As a result, we develop a fear of abandonment that quickly sabotages all of our relationships because we are so preocupied with feeling inferior to those people we come to love. We then overthink everything when friends and partners don't make time for us. They may not return a text and it never occurs to us that they are simply busy. Instead we internaliize it and decide we are not worth their time or love.

We then worry that they will terminate the friendship or love relationship and leave us. And so we become clingy and eventually smother them with our neediness.

Once we have driven them away, we need a means of emotionally medicating away our pain, so we turn to alcohol, drugs, shopping, gambling or any number of other addictive behaviors.

This retreat will study the root causes of our addictive personalities, and solutions for replacing our feelings of worthlessness with feelings of self-respect.

This retreat begins with dinner on Friday night at 6:00 pm and ends with lunch on Sunday at Noon.

Dear Padre,

I have always been an "every Sunday" Catholic. My problem is that holy Communion doesn't feel that special. I believe that it's the Body and Blood of Christ, but receiving feels "routine." Sometimes I'm even distracted while receiving. Help?



Do you remember the story of the transfiguration of Jesus? (See Luke 9:28-36.) Jesus took his three special disciples, Peter, James, and John, up on the mountain, and while Jesus was praying, what did they do? They fell asleep! In the very presence of Jesus, their Lord and Master.

Human beings cannot maintain feelings of awe and ecstasy for long periods of time. We would be exhausted. Feelings don't always reflect the specialness of the moment. That is why good habits are so important. Feelings may elude us, but we can fall back on the habit of Sunday Mass. Just as two contented, long-married people don't feel like they did on their honeymoon, they still quietly enjoy the habit of each other's company.

Lent is coming soon. You might consider shaking up your routine a little. Attend one weekday Mass. Prepare for Sunday Mass by reading the Scriptures for that Sunday and praying the entrance antiphon or the psalm. If you don't already, consider volunteering as a choir member, lector, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion. Meanwhile, continue to receive holy Communion, giving thanks that it is readily available, and perhaps offer a prayer for communities where Communion every Sunday is not possible.
