## Weekend of February 22-23 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary



**Welcome:** The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



As with all sacraments, the Sacrament of Marriage involves efficacious signs. We now turn to those signs to help understand this sacrament.

The sign of the Sacrament of Marriage is a hearing sign. It can be found in the vows. In those vows, a man and a woman give themselves to another person. The vows declare that a man, by giving himself totally to a woman becomes one with her, and a woman giving herself totally to a man becomes one with him. There can be no separation if a person gives all of himself/herself to another. Their lives become intertwined and one. By thus giving themselves to the other, the couple become a sign of God Himself, the One who gives Himself away in love. In all their shared life, they are called to show us what true love looks like.

Of course, this union is between two people, both of whom are weak human beings. All of us fail in our efforts to selflessly love. Selfishness is indeed a strong drive within us! However, we need to remember something that is very important, and something that comes into effect in the Sacrament of Marriage. The man is not alone. Jesus lives in him because of Baptism. The woman is not alone either. Jesus lives in her because of Baptism. When a man and a woman seek to enter into the Sacrament of Marriage, Jesus is present with them. As the man states his vows and makes an unconditional and total gift of himself to the one who will become his wife, not only does he give himself to the woman, but Jesus uses the will of the man to once again give himself to the woman. The same dual exchange happens as the woman speaks her vows to the man. So, the couple actually shares not only their human lives with one another, but also, they share the life of Jesus with each other! The presence of this shared life of Jesus makes available to them Jesus's own strength to love, and that strength is total. It was out of love that Jesus chose to die that we might live. Jesus's love was not limited by human selfishness.

So, in the words of the vows, a man and woman signify that they give themselves to each other. Because of God's presence and gift of this sacrament, what they symbolize with their words indeed takes place. Their human lives are shared with each other along with the life of Jesus himself.

# **The Root of Addiction**

## How Addiction Begins. How Serenity Begins

Although there is no cure for addiction, it can be managed. Taming the addictive personality requires living 12 Step spirituality, relying on a Higher Power and the determination to take back control of your life.

The addictive personality develops in childhood for most people. And it's fueled by the belief that we are "not good enough" to be loved-- by our family, God or anyone else.

As a result, we develop a fear of abandonment that quickly sabotages all of our relationships because we are so preocupied with feeling inferior to those people we come to love. We then overthink everything when friends and partners don't make time for us. They may not return a text and it never occurs to us that they are simply busy. Instead we internaliize it and decide we are not worth their time or love.

We then worry that they will terminate the friendship or love relationship and leave us. And so we become clingy and eventually smother them with our neediness.

Once we have driven them away, we need a means of emotionally medicating away our pain, so we turn to alcohol, drugs, shopping, gambling or any number of other addictive behaviors.

This retreat will study the root causes of our addictive personalities, and solutions for replacing our feelings of worthlessness with feelings of self-respect.

This retreat begins with dinner on Friday night at 6:00 pm and ends with lunch on Sunday at Noon.

## Dear Padre,

My ex broke up with me. I find myself hoping he gets subjected to the same emotional pain as I have. I hate feeling this way, so how do I ask God to take away this pain and help me forgive my ex?

What you are sharing is your hurt and confusion. Although your boyfriend was ready to end the relationship, you were not. It seems you are still not ready to move on. That is OK. Everyone has his or her own manner of dealing with disappointment, and there is no perfect timeframe.

More than your boyfriend's suffering, you desire freedom for yourself and a return to a healthy sense of your own personhood. You perceive him as happy and perhaps wonder how that's possible while you are still struggling. This is all very normal, and it's part of the process we all experience when an important relationship changes.



You will work through this. You will love again. You will no longer be triggered by strong feelings when you encounter him in the future. But you are going to have to do the hard work of growing, maturing, and learning to let go. Begin by praying for his well-being. And if you can't do that, ask God for the grace to want to pray for his well-being. Certainly, the Lord will help you, but he won't magically take away your pain. There are no shortcuts.
