Our Lady of the Desert

The Ten Commandments are a series of laws God gave to the nation of Israel during their journey through the desert to the Promised Land. God's aim was to form a people in His image. He sought to help them to understand how to live as His people. An account of these laws can be found in chapter 20 of The Book of Exodus.

In Exodus 20: 2-5a, we read, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall not have other gods beside me. You shall not make for yourself an idol or a likeness of anything in the heavens above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or serve them." This is the First of the Ten Commandments, which Catholics generally state as: I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange gods before me.

The Catholic Catechism has this to say about the First Commandment: "Adoring God, praying to Him, offering Him the worship that belongs to Him, fulfilling the promises and vows made to Him are acts of the virtue of religion which fall under obedience to the first commandment" (CCC # 2135). We will flesh out our understanding of this first commandment by looking at these various issues.

LENT

As we enter into the Season of Lent, the Church encourages us to enter into a time of conversion, a time where we move away from sin and selfishness to become more like Christ. It is a time for all of us to take the need of conversion seriously. All of us are sinners. All of us live lives not in union with the teachings of Jesus. All of us frequently forget that we are to image God and His love through the way we live our lives.

In the Liturgy for Ash Wednesday, the Church presented us with a way of celebrating conversion this Lent. The gospel on Wednesday has Jesus proposing three types of piety aimed at reforming our hearts and lives. These three types of piety are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. But, why does Jesus propose these activities, and how do they help us?

As we live our life, it is so easy to start to think that life is all about me. I am the center of my life. The purpose of life is to watch out for number one, by assuring that I get everything I need. However, this way of looking at life is incorrect. God is the center of life, not us. We are here to do His will, not our own. As we enter into prayer, that is what we remember. Prayer leads us to put God and his will first in our lives.

Another misconception about life is that the only way to find happiness is to work at collecting all those things which we think will be more fulfillment to our life. However, we quickly find out that when it comes to happiness, enough is never enough. We constantly need more; more money, more things to fill up the emptiness inside us. This is where fasting comes in. As we voluntarily go without something which we find pleasurable, we are reminding ourselves that there is nothing that this world can offer us to totally fill up the void we experience in the center of our being. Only God, and drawing close to Him, can ever truly make us happy.

Finally, we are tempted to live life for ourselves. We are all important. If a neighbor gets in the way of our happiness, then we need to get that neighbor out of our way. Almsgiving simply means sharing what God has given us with others. Such sharing reminds us that we are not more important than other people. Part of our life has to be taking care of others, just like Jesus always gave him self away on the other's behalf. Again, we are not the center of the universe, God and our neighbor are!

Lent is a time to get our life ordered correctly. Prayer, sacrifice, and almsgiving help us to do so.


Lenten Regulations

We remind you of the obligations for this Season of Lent. First, we are asked to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on every Friday of Lent. This obligation exists for everyone over the age of 14 years old. In addition, on both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we are asked to fast. This fast means that we are allowed to eat two small meals, (which together would not add up to a normal sized meal), and then one full meal. This obligation to fast exists for all Catholics ages 15 to 59. However, the Bishops remind us, "THOSE THAT ARE EXCUSED FROM FAST AND ABSTINENCE OUTSIDE THE AGE LIMITS INCLUDE THE PHYSICALLY OR MENTALLY ILL INCLUDING INDIVIDUALS SUFFERING FROM CHRONIC ILLNESSES SUCH AS DIABETES. ALSO EXCLUDED ARE PREGNANT OR NURSING WOMEN. IN ALL CASES, COMMON SENSE SHOULD PREVAIL, AND ILL PERSONS SHOULD NOT FURTHER JEOPARDIZE THEIR HEALTH BY FASTING."

An icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be the centerpiece of a special Sacred Heart Holy Hour at Our Lady of the Desert Church at 5PM on Friday, April 4, 2025. The holy hour, flowing from the jubilee for the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (Dec. 27, 2023 – Jun. 27, 2025) and inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical letter Dilexit Nos (He Loved Us), is sponsored by Knights of Columbus (Our Lady of the Desert Council 15704). During the holy hour, an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome, will be displayed. This reproduction of the original image bears the blessing of Pope Francis and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world as part of the Knights of Columbus Pilgrim Icon Program. Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly has said that as Knights bring these icons across the world to their parishes, he hopes "they will invite their families — and all families — to consecrate their homes and themselves to the Sacred Heart." He further said that "In the heart of Christ, we see the heart of the Father. And we ask Our Lord to help us make his heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what he sees and loves in us." The Sacred Heart Holy Hour will include readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart, and time for silent prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The prayer service will lead all present to grow in their love of God and devotion to his Most Sacred Heart. Please Spread the Word, everyone is welcome

Please join us in congratulating our 'Family of the Month' - the Francis, Bob and Chris.







Dear Padre,

Does the Church teach how we should dress to go to Mass? Maybe I'm just old-fashioned, but the way some people dress seems very disrespectful.

Church teaching, dogmas, doctrines, and creedal formulations are not the specific resources to consult in order to answer this question. It is properly a matter of discipline and practice, although the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* does direct that "bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey respect" (1387). There are many commentaries on what exactly "respect" might mean.

It would be very difficult to establish a universal dress code. The many different cultures, climates, and particular circumstances of a specific

Catholic community make a dress code unmanageable. It seems that you judge the local practice not up to your standards. Your judgment may be correct, or you may have unreasonable expectations. There was a time when "Sunday best" was the established norm. In other communities, the expectation would be "business casual" as a bare minimum. Now, it seems standards and practices are very fluid and flexible. All of this being said, it is ultimately a pastoral concern, not doctrinal or dogmatic. Try not to allow how other people dress distract you from your purpose at Mass. While they may not look like you imagine they should, their prayer might be genuine and heartfelt. •
