Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. Our Lady of the Desert

The Catechism notes that our moral life has its source in faith in God who reveals his love for us. St Paul echoes this when he writes, "Through him we have received the grace of apostleship, to bring about the obedience of faith, for the sake of his name..." (Rom 1: 5). Paul further states that "ignorance of God" is the basis of all moral deviations. Our duty is to believe in God and bear witness to him through the way we live. If we fail to know God correctly, we will certainly fail to live as he asks us to live.

The first commandment, therefore, requires us to nourish and protect our faith with prudence and vigilance. We are called to seek always to grow in our Faith. We are asked to reject and oppose anything that is opposed to our faith. Our response to God's revelation of his love for us must always be a faith-based response. We should seek to do what this loving God wants us to do.

The first commandment points out that sinning against our faith knowledge is wrong. The catechism points to several ways this is true. First, it refers to "voluntary doubt." This doubt disregards or refuses to hold as true what God has revealed and the Church has proposed to us for belief. "Involuntary doubt" is another path to sin that the catechism highlights. Involuntary doubt refers to a hesitation in believing, or a difficulty in overcoming objections we have with the faith (CCC # 2088). In both cases, our doubt leads us away from trusting in the truthfulness of the God who loves us so much.

The catechism also refers to four other ways we can sin against faith. "Incredulity" is the rejection of revealed truth, or a willful refusal to accept it. "Heresy" is the obstinate post-baptismal denial of some truth that our faith calls us to believe. "Apostacy" is the total rejection of the Christian faith. "Schism" is the refusal of submission to the Roman Pontiff or refusal of communion with the members of the Church (CCC # 2089). Our proper response to God must always be found in faith!


It's Easter Basket Blessing Time!

An icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be the centerpiece of a special Sacred Heart Holy Hour at Our Lady of the Desert Church at 5PM on Friday, April 4, **2025**. The holy hour, flowing from the jubilee for the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (Dec. 27, 2023 – Jun. 27, 2025) and inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical letter Dilexit Nos (He Loved Us), is sponsored by Knights of Columbus (Our Lady of the Desert Council 15704). During the holy hour, an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome, will be displayed. This reproduction of the original image bears the blessing of Pope Francis and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world as part of the Knights of Columbus Pilgrim Icon Program. Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly has said that as Knights bring these icons across the world to their parishes, he

hopes "they will invite their families — and all families — to consecrate their homes and themselves to the Sacred Heart." He further said that "In the heart of Christ, we see the heart of the Father. And we ask Our Lord to help us make his heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what he sees and loves in us." The Sacred Heart Holy Hour will include readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart, and time for silent prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The prayer service will lead all present to grow in their love of God and devotion to his Most Sacred Heart. Please Spread the Word, everyone is welcome.







People who have no boundaries are often victimized and frustrated because they are constantly giving their personal power away to others. They do what everyone else wants to do; they wear what they think other people want them to wear; and they take the blame for everything, even when they aren't at fault, without defending themselves.

As a result, boundary-less people end up feeling abused, angry and resentful. And as is well documented, resentment feeds addictive behaviors.

Boundaries are lines we draw between ourselves and others. They mark our independence and yet allow us to be interdependent with others. Boundaries define who we are and they tell the world that we are as equally important as everyone else is.

Boundaries also define our views on behavior. They establish what behaviors we are willing to accept from others and what behaviors we are not willing to accept. Boundaries allow for respectful confrontation. In this way, boundaries protect everyone from being abused and victimized.

If you are struggling to establish important boundaries, this retreat is for you. It will help you to regain respect for yourself as you learn to own your personal power by learning to set proper boundaries with family, friends, coworkers and others.

Dear Padre,

Is it OK if I receive holy Communion more than once a day? Part of my routine is to go to early morning Mass in my parish, even on days I know I'm going to another Mass, like a wedding or funeral, or sometimes another Mass for that day.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that by the very nature of what the Eucharist intends and celebrates, those who participate in the great mystery of our faith should "receive the Lord's Body" (1388). In other words, reception of holy Communion is strongly recommended and is understood as the ordinary practice for all who participate in the Mass. Proper preparation and disposition are presumed as both necessary and important.

In response to a specific "dubium" or question about this practice and expectation, in 1984 the Pontifical Commission on the Code of Canon Law



issued an authentic interpretation of the Church's understanding of this practice. It mandated that "the faithful may receive the Holy Eucharist only a second time on the same day" (CCC, 1388, footnote 222). This directive is intended to establish the general norm and practice for the reception of holy Communion. Your practice, as a result of this norm, is directly representative of the understanding of the Church.
