Our Lady of the Desert

The catechism next turns its explanations to the idea of *Idolatry*. Obviously, idolatry violates the first commandment (you shall have no other God besides me). While most of us do not believe in more than one God, there is always the danger of holding something else as being greater or more important than God. God calls us to hold him as the most important thing in our lives. The catechism states, "Man commits idolatry whenever he honors and reveres a creature in place of God, whether this be gods or demons, ... power, pleasure, race, ancestors, the state, money, etc." (CCC # 2113). God must always be the greatest good, the greatest desire in our lives. It seems to me that in our country today, many people treat democracy as being more important than God. So many people seem to think that if the government or the voting people say something is ok, then it is ok, no matter what God teaches! Morality is God's domain, not the domain of democracy or the state.

Closely tied to this, the catechism also points out that *divination* of any kind breaks the first commandment. Divination shows a lack of trust in God in connection with the future. Rather than simply trusting that God loves us and will be there with us as we live into the future, many people have an irrational fear of the future. The catechism states it this way, "Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretations of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe God alone" (CCC # 2116).



Dear Padre,

How do we maintain our faith in a world that shames religion and creates doubt in our beliefs?

I would respond to your question with one of my own: "When has it ever been different?" In what place has there been universal praise and acceptance of the practices of faith and belief? When has there been a time when there is no doubt? This is a good question for this Sunday, when we hear about St. Thomas, the doubting disciple.

Many years ago, unanimity might have been understood as the norm in a tight-knit neighborhood community of people with the same experience and belief. However, in the wide world today that is so connected and disconnected at the same time, sameness and uniformity cannot be assumed. It may cause unease, or even fear, to learn that someone disagrees with you, perhaps even someone you love, but it should no longer be a surprise or considered out of the ordinary.



Doubt can help a person grow in faith and belief. Even though doubt is challenging, it is often a necessary experience in order to be strengthened and to persevere. Doubt is not something that should cause us to quiver in fear, but rather to rejoice in hope, in the confidence that what we believe is worth living and has something to teach us.

A WORD FROM POPE FRANCIS

Let us ask ourselves: at home, in my family, at work, in my community, do I foster fellowship, am I a weaver of reconciliation? Do I commit myself to defusing conflict, to bringing forgiveness in place of hatred, and peace in place of resentment? Do I avoid hurting others by not gossiping, which always kills?

HOMILY, ROME, APRIL 24, 2022

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
