

Our Lady of the Desert

We have seen that the Second Commandment calls for the respect of God and his name. The catechism follows up this teaching by beginning to speak about some ways in which God's name is not honored. First, it states that any abuse of God's name is forbidden. However, the same thing goes for Jesus, Mary, or one of the other saints. They too must be honored and respected. (See CCC #2146).

The catechism also points out that promises made to others in God's name "engage the Divine honor fidelity, truthfulness, and authority. They must be respected in justice" (CCC 3 2147). So, saying things like, "I swear to God" or "with God as my judge" require and demand truthfulness. To intentionally lie while speaking in God's name is in violation of this commandment. In an interesting note, the catechism says that to be unfaithful to such promises is a misuse of God's name (as he is always the truthful one), and in some way makes God out to be a liar. (See CCC 2147).

Dear Padre,

What does the Catholic Church teach about miracles?

Miracles are extraordinary occurrences without natural explanation that manifest the presence and power of God. We believe in miracles "because of the authority of God himself who reveals them, who can neither deceive nor be deceived" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 156).

Christ's multiplication of the loaves is the only miracle

recorded by all four evangelists. He performed many other natural miracles—calming the storm, walking on water—and numerous healings as well—curing the deaf and mute, the woman with a hemorrhage. These signs attest that the Father sent Jesus and "they invite belief in him" (*CCC*, 548). Moreover, Jesus' miracles "also confirm that the kingdom has already arrived on earth..." ("Dogmatic Constitution on the Church," 5).

Today, God still manifests his presence in the Church through miracles. For example, potential medical healings are rigorously investigated by the Vatican for sainthood causes. Other supernatural occurrences—such as apparitions and eucharistic phenomena—are likewise thoroughly and prudently investigated with caution to maintain the Church's credibility and prevent confusion among the faithful.

To that end, in May 2024, the Vatican updated its guidelines for assessing apparitions, visions, and alleged revelations, and reaffirmed that a bishop cannot rule on the validity of a particular case before the pope formally deems it to be "supernatural" for pastoral value.
