

In its treatment of the first commandment, the catechism next turns to look at the sin of Atheism. Atheists deny the very existence of God. Some of them totally reject the idea of the spiritual. They believe that material is all there is. These types of secular humanists would see life as depending wholly and complete-ly upon people. They do not need, nor have the help of God, in living their lives. To refuse to believe in God and to offer love to Him obviously offends against the first commandment.

The catechism also talks about another sin associated with atheism. They point out that believers who are lazy or inconsistent in their living of their faith, can give bad example that leads others to doubt God's existence. When we find ourselves living in such a way that God becomes secondary in our lives, we violate the first commandment.

The catechism also speaks of Agnosticism. Agnostics say they are unsure if God exists, so they live their lives as if He didn't exist. Obviously, this kind of attitude does not give God the honor He deserves, and is therefore a violation of the first commandment. \sim *Fr. Brian Johnson C.Ss.R.*

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Codependent Crazies

Codependency is a fear-based addictive attraction to another person. Someone suffering from codependency feels "lesser than" other people. They believe they aren't "good enough" and become dependent on another person to be responsible for all of their happiness. So, they choose someone to provide their happiness for them and make that person into their false Higher Power.

This chosen person is then expected to always be available to make the codependent feel loveable. When their false Higher Power isn't available, the codependent feels anxious, worthless and fears abandonment.

In their desperation for love and acceptance, the codependent increasingly takes the other person hostage and eventually smothers the life out of them. In most cases, this causes the false Higher Power to abandon the needy codependent person.

If you are suffering from a codependency or are in recovery but have relapsed, this retreat will provide you with information to move forward toward a healthier state of mind, self-acceptance and self-love.



Dear Padre,

When is it OK to medicate for pain? If my relative is in hospice, should I permit the use of drugs that hasten his or her death?

When someone we love is dying, we do not want him or her to be in pain. It is only natural to want to ease or end all suffering. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* offers these guidelines: "The use of painkillers to alleviate the sufferings of the dying, even at the risk of shortening their days, can be morally in conformity with human dignity



if death is not willed as either an end or a means, but only foreseen and tolerated as inevitable" (*CCC* 2279). In other words, it is permissible to medicate for pain, but you must not use narcotics as an end or means to hasten someone's death—only to alleviate pain and minimize a person's suffering. To give medication to cause death rather than merely to relieve pain is not allowed.

It is important to have a discussion about the types of treatment a person would want when they are dying. It is also important to have a discussion with your pastor or another priest or chaplain—someone who can help you discern whether the action, the intention, and the circumstances are consistent with Church teaching. Many times, one is forced to make very difficult decisions about medical care, and it is always good to have someone we trust who can help us make the best choice. •
