
As we continue to think about the first commandment, the catechism next turns to what it refers to as "irreligion." It specifically mentions 3 ways we can enter into irreligious actions:

Tempting God is the first way mentioned. The catechism states, "Tempting God consists in putting his goodness and almighty power to the test by word or deed" (CCC # 2119). The catechism continues, "The challenge contained in such tempting of God wounds the respect and trust we owe our creator and Lord. It always harbors doubt about his love, his providence, and his power" (CCC # 2119). Thus, saying things like, "I will only believe you are with me if I see 10 Volkswagen bugs in the next minute," show a lack of trust in God, and therefore violate this first commandment.

The catechism next deals with sacrilege. Sacrilege is defined as "profaning or treating unworthily the sacraments and other liturgical actions, as well as persons, things or places consecrated to God" (CCC # 2120). All these types of things that are dedicated to God must be treated with respect and honor if the first commandment is to be obeyed.

The final type of irreligion is simony. Simony is defined as "the buying or selling of spiritual things." God's love and grace are given freely. In simony, we try to take possession of these things through our own power. The catechism puts it this way, "It is impossible to appropriate to oneself spiritual goods and behave toward them as their owner or master, for they have their source in God. One can receive them only from him, without payment" (CCC # 2121). All grace comes as a free gift from God, not as something we earn or buy.


