Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



We now turn to the 3<sup>rd</sup> commandment. The Book of Exodus states: "Remember the sabbath day—keep it holy." (Ex 20: 8) The traditional way of stating this commandment is Keep holy the Lord's Day. The Sabbath was a very important day in Jewish life. In the story of creation from Genesis, it says that God worked for 6 days in creating the world, but then rested on the 7<sup>th</sup> day from all his work (see Ex 20: 11). When Israel refrained from work on the 7<sup>th</sup> day, the Sabbath, they were imitating God. Moreover, the Sabbath was seen as a gift from God. God realized that human beings cannot just tirelessly work. They needed to rest as well. This prohibition against Sabbath work was God's way of codifying this fact. It was a constant reminder to the rich and the overseers of workers, that those workers too needed a break. They too were exempt from work on the Sabbath. The sabbath was therefore seen as a way of honoring human nature in all people, even in the slaves and other little ones.

This day of rest was seen as something necessary for the welfare of people. It respected them as human beings, not just workers.

## Dear Padre,

## Some of my non-Catholic friends say the bread and wine are just symbols of the Body and Blood of Jesus. Is there documented proof that we receive the Body and Blood at **Communion?**

Your non-Catholic friends are accurately representing their understanding of the Eucharist within their Christian denomination, but it is not the Catholic understanding. Catholics believe that, "in the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist, the 'body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ, and therefore, the whole Christ, is truly, really, and substantially contained'" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1374). Therefore, Catholics do not

believe that the Eucharist is a symbol of Jesus but rather, "This presence is called 'real'" (CCC 1374). To answer your question regarding "documented proof," this can be offered only by the consistent and unchanging witness of the Christian community, found in the Catholic Church, that has never wavered in belief or practice of this understanding. At the same time, we understand that it is a mystery. It is not something that can be placed under a microscope or dissected. As a mystery, it is not subject to the laws of science and biology. Such laws are not applied to theological mystery, which goes beyond what can be physically seen but is "seen" through the eyes of faith. As the hymn proclaims: "Look beyond the bread you eat, see your Savior and your Lord" ("Look Beyond," Darryl Ducote).
