Our Lady of the Desert

The catechism points out that marriage and family are ordered to the good of the spouses and to the procreation and education of children (CCC # 2201). The love of the spouses and begetting of children create among the members of a family personal relationships and primordial responsibilities (CCC # 2201). Certain respect and care for all the members of the family are called for.

The catechism points out that the family is the basis of society. In our families, we learn how to interact with one another and with others. The church has always, therefore, called for the respect of families and their protection by the state and civil authorities (CCC #2210). It is also in our families where we learn to take responsibility for the young, the old, the sick, the handicapped, and the poor (See CCC# 2208).

The fourth commandment is also understood by the catechism as illuminating other relationships in society. "In our brothers and sisters, we see the children of our parents; in our cousins, the descendants of our ancestors; in our fellow citizens, the children of our country; in the baptized; the children of our mother the Church; in every human person, a son or daughter of the One who wishes to be called "Our Father" (CCC # 2212).

The fourth commandment has much more to say than simply that children should respect their parents!


OCIA







Dear Padre,

Who wrote the Lord's Prayer? I know the Lord's Prayer comes from Scripture, but who composed it as we say it today?

When the disciples asked the Lord to teach them to pray, he taught them the prayer we know as the Our Father. Two versions of that prayer appear in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. The version used in the Church's liturgies is derived from Matthew 6:9–13. In fact, citing St. Thomas Aquinas' *Summa Theologiae*, the *Catechism of*



the Catholic Church calls the Lord's Prayer the "most perfect of prayers" (2774), teaching us not only what things to pray for in our prayer but also in what order, or priority, we should desire them. It is at the heart of every individual and communal prayer.

We pray the Our Father, bearing in mind and heart the intimate relationship we have with our God as sons and daughters by adoption through our baptism. The specific wording of our prayers is a work in progress. What we think of as the final wording is that which the Church has approved and makes the most sense for prayer as a community. What is most important is that the substance of the prayer reflects the same matter the Lord used in the prayer. •
