Welcome: The Redemptorist Community and Pastoral Staff of the Redemptorist Renewal Center extends a warm and loving welcome to all who come here to pray and worship in our church. We are a community that welcomes all people as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. Together we are the body of Christ, living and active today.



In the Christian Churches, the sabbath day of rest is transferred to Sunday. For Christians, Jesus rose on a Sunday, thus making it the first day, the day of salvation. Sunday is also often referred to as "the 8th day." As such, it emphasizes the resurrection and new life that Jesus won for us. It becomes a day when we participate in the life of the Spirit whom Jesus gave as a gift to the Church. It points to a future when we will have eternal rest with God.

Canon 1247 of The Code of Canon Law, the official law of the Catholic Church states that on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, Catholics are obliged to assist at mass. Mass attendance is the perfect way of fulfilling the call this commandment gives us to worship God. However, mere attendance is not enough. We are called to not only attend, but to participate! It does no good to just sit in the pews. We give God praise and worship only when we pay attention and join in the prayers, responses, and singing that takes place. This 3rd commandment calls us to true worship on the Lord's Day and on Holy Days of Obligation. Full participation in mass is seen as testimony of our belonging to Christ and to his Church (See CCC # 2182).

Dear Padre,

At Mass during the Our Father, should we hold hands, *lift our hands up, or keep our hands to ourselves?*

Among many ancient religions, it was common to extend one's hands toward heaven while praying. This practice has continued in the Mass, where the rubrics indicate that the priest should extend his hands at certain points, including during the Our Father. The celebrant represents all the people with this gesture. The deacon is expressly forbidden to hold his hands up in prayer. There is no particular gesture assigned to the rest of the congregation. Some may be holding hands, some lifting their hands, some standing with arms crossed.



The variety of postures is not a problem in itself. The problem is when people become distracted or judgmental of others. As a rule of thumb, I suggest doing what the rest of the congregation does. As stated in the "Order of the Mass," written by the Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy in 2003, "The people are called as members of an organic whole, not as disparate individuals. A Christian assembly that worships 'with one heart and mind' (Acts 4:32) naturally moves toward and consciously chooses a common posture as a sign of its unity. Such common posture 'both expresses and fosters the intention and spiritual attitude of the participants'" (28). The gestures at Mass are not as important as the essence of the Mass, and part of that essence is our unity in the body of Christ.
