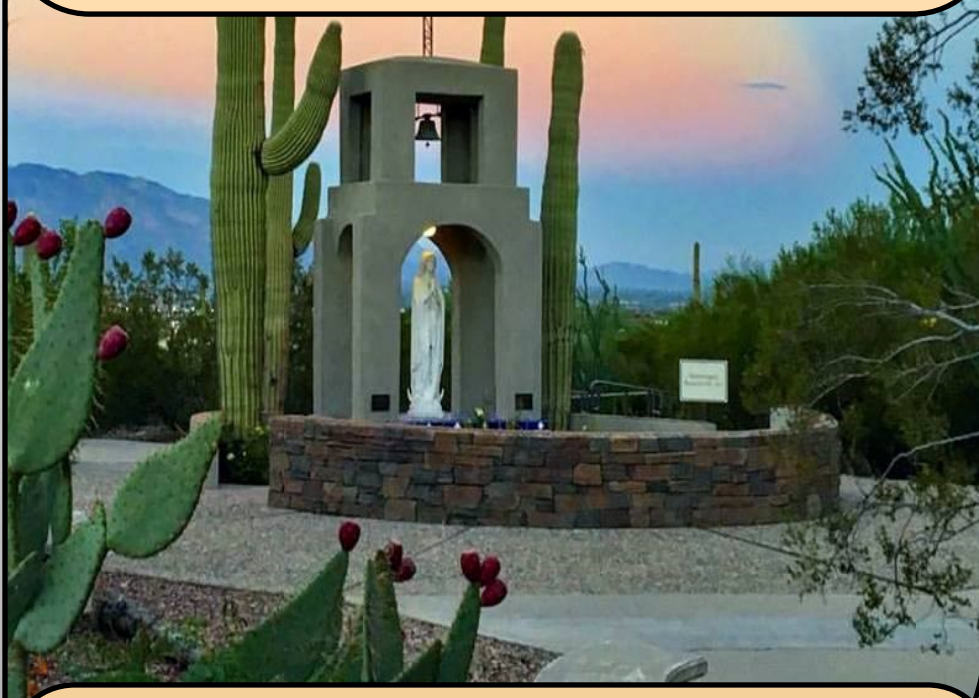

# Our Lady of the Desert



After the general respect for life discussion, the Catechism next turns to look at concrete actions that fall under the 5<sup>th</sup> commandment. The first is intentional homicide. The catechism states that, of course, “The fifth commandment forbids direct and intentional killing as gravely sinful” (CCC # 2268). Among all the types of murder that exist, the catechism singles out “Infanticide (killing of an infant), fratricide (killing of a brother or sister), parricide (killing of one’s parents or close relatives), and the murder of a spouse” as being particularly grave by reason of the human relationship that is involved and the natural bonds which these actions break.

The fifth commandment also forbids doing anything with an intention of doing something indirectly to bring about the death of another. We must not expose another to mortal danger without grave reason. We are also required to assist someone in personal danger. To ignore their needs is sinful (CCC # 2269). The catechism next refers to Amos 8: 4-10 from the Scriptures. In this passage, God condemns the unethical actions of the rich towards the poor. The catechism states, “Those whose usurious and avaricious dealings lead to hunger and death of their brethren in the human family indirectly commit homicide, which is imputable to them” (see CCC 2269). The catechism furthers this thought by stating, “*Unintentional* killing is not morally imputable. But one is not exonerated from grave offense if, without proportionate reasons, he has acted in a way that brings about someone’s death, even without the intention to do so” (CCC # 2269).

# Emotional Healing

## Reclaiming Our Self-Worth

Self-worth is the value you place on yourself, which can be influenced by your experiences, societal expectations, and how you perceive your abilities and qualities. It reflects your self-esteem and can affect your overall mental health and well-being.

### *Positive Psychology*

Countless people struggle with having good self-worth. Generally, self-worth is something we are inherently born with. But some of us were deprived of developing a positive sense of self-worth because we grew up in dysfunctional household where one or both of our caregivers were suffering from poor self-worth.

As a result, they passed on their negative feelings about themselves, teaching us to see ourselves in a similar way to how they saw themselves.

Low self-worth in adulthood keeps us from feeling worthy of love, can interfere with our studies or job performance and has a tremendous negative impact on our personal relationships. We can't expect others are going to love us if we aren't willing to accept and love ourselves.

Self-worth, self-esteem, self-acceptance and self-love are all interconnected. Come learn to take your power back from the childhood trauma that told you that you weren't worthy of love or success.

# Lost Without Love

## Living with Fear of Abandonment

**"Ultimately, childhood emotional neglect teaches you not only to abandon your emotions but also to abandon yourself."**

*Psychology Today*

Human relationships are difficult and messy for many reasons. One of those reasons is fear of abandonment. Many people grow up in families where one or both parents are emotionally unavailable.

Emotionally unavailable parents are unable to model emotional intelligence and meet the emotional needs of their children. As a result, the emotional development of those children is stunted.

Worse yet is the fact that when a parent isn't able to respond affectionately to the joys and sorrows of their children, those children begin to believe that their feelings and needs don't count.

When children are continually met with emotional coldness, they develop the belief that they are somehow unacceptable to their parents, feel like they have to earn love to be loved and develop a fear of abandonment if they aren't able to succeed at winning their parents approval.

Feeling unloveable, the child then abandons him or herself. As they grow older, the fear of being rejected haunts them and can destroy their relationships. No matter how much love and acceptance another person may offer them, the emotionally abandoned person is unable to believe it or accept it for fear of being left behind again.

Awareness is the key. This retreat will provide awareness into this problem and offer solutions to counter fear of abandonment.

# Dear Padre,

## *Is it sacrilegious to throw away a sacramental?*

“Sacramentals do not confer the grace of the Holy Spirit in the way that the sacraments do, but by the Church’s prayer, they prepare us to receive and dispose us to cooperate with it” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1670). Therefore, sacramentals confer grace through the Church’s power of prayer and, if blessed, should not be thrown away but burned and/or buried. If the object has not been blessed, it can be discarded; however, it could also be donated to a Catholic ministry (school, prison, hospital, etc.) that would benefit from its distribution. (If a religious object was included in an unsolicited appeal letter from a charitable organization, it is safe to assume that it was not blessed.)

If the object is worn or broken, it should be substantially altered so that it loses its form as a sacramental and then returned to the earthly elements. For example, a worn scapular should be burned and the ashes buried; a damaged statue should be further broken into smaller fragments and buried. A European tradition on the Vigil of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist (June 23) is to burn old sacramentals in bonfires and bury the ashes. Burning and/or burial respects the sacred nature once held by these items and prevents their adaptation for trivial use. Reverence and discretion are proper for whatever method of disposal. ●
