

# Our Lady of the Desert

The 6<sup>th</sup> Commandment is stated, "You shall not commit adultery." (Ex 20:14) However, as the catechism teaches on this commandment, it goes much further. The catechism tries to sketch out a broad view of sexual matters. All these issues are seen as fitting under the 6<sup>th</sup> Commandment.

The catechism first speaks of the general topic of Chastity. It states, "Chastity means the successful integration of sexuality within the person and thus the inner unity of man in his bodily and spiritual being." (CCC #2337) Each of us must fully integrate chastity into our lives.

"All Baptized persons are called to chastity... All Christ's faithful are called to live a chaste life in keeping with their particular states of life." (CCC # 2348) The catechism adds that "Some profess virginity or consecrated celibacy which enables them to give themselves to God alone...Others live in the way prescribed for all by the moral law, whether they are married or single." (CCC #2349) It is pointed out that married couples are called to live conjugal chastity (sexual relations only with their spouse), while single people should live all their relationships in chastity. Engaged couples, too, are called to chastity in their relationship. "They should preserve for marriage the expressions of affection that belong to married love." (CCC # 2350)


# A Prayer to St. Joseph, Defender of Life

# **Living with Fear of Abandonment**

"Ultimately, childhood emotional neglect teaches you not only to abandon your emotions but also to abandon yourself."

Psychology Today

Human relationships are difficult and messy for many reasons. One of those reasons is fear of abandonment. Many people grow up in families where one or both parents are emotionally unavailable.

Emotionally unavailable parents are unable to model emotional intelligence and meet the emotional needs of their children. As a result, the emotional development of those children is stunted.

Worse yet is the fact that when a parent isn't able to respond affectionately to the joys and sorrows of their children, those children begin to believe that their feelings and needs don't count.

When children are continually met with emotional coldness, they develop the belief that they are somehow unacceptable to their parents, feel like they have to earn love to be loved and develop a fear of abandonment if they aren't able to succeed at winning their parents approval.

Feeling unloveable, the child then abandons him or herself. As they grow older, the fear of being rejected haunts them and can destroy their relationships. No matter how much love and acceptance another person may offer them, the emotionally abandoned person is unable to believe it or accept it for fear of being left behind again.

Awareness is the key. This retreat will provide awareness into this problem and offer solutions to counter fear of abandonment.



# Dear Padre,

# Why does my parish priest preach about love practically every Sunday?

"Through the course of the liturgical year, the homily sets forth the mysteries of faith and the standards of the Christian life on the basis of the sacred text" (*Lectionary*, 24). A translation of the English word "love" appears in the Bible more than 500 times; by comparison, "sin" appears approximately 400 times. Thus, insofar as the homily "should be an explanation of some aspect of the readings from sacred Scripture" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 65), God's word on "love" is far too prevalent to overlook.

Over time, they become so intert

Pope Francis called God's word "a love letter, written to us by the One who knows us best." In the Bible, this God who desires to bestow his love on us (See 1 John 3:1), is essentially telling us, "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways." How we love God in return may be likened to two partners in a committed relationship.

Over time, they become so intertwined that they can even assume each other's speech patterns, mannerisms, and views. Likewise, for those who love God, over the years we can begin to internalize the words from God's "love letter" and reflect them in our Christian speech, actions, and outlook! "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him" (John 14:23).
