

Our Lady of the Desert

The Catechism continues to look at ways we break the 6th Commandment. Next up is Fornication. The catechism states that "Fornication is carnal union between an unmarried man and an unmarried woman." (CCC # 2353) Because the Church teaches that sexual relations are ordered towards the good of the spouses and the rearing and education of children, premarital sex becomes an offense against the very purpose of sexual activity. The catechism also points out that such relations can also be a source of scandal to the young. Such scandal is also seen as seriously sinful.

Pornography is the next offense treated in the catechism. Pornography is defined as "removing real or simulated sexual acts from the intimacy of the partners, in order to display them deliberately to third parties." (CCC # 2354) Once again, the catechism says that such "pornography offends against chastity because it perverts the conjugal act, the intimate giving of spouses to each other." (CCC #2354) In addition, pornography is seen as an action which turns a person into "an object of base pleasure and illicit profit for others." (CCC #2354) Again, pornography is seen as a very serious sin against God's plan of sexual activity only being shared between marriage partners. As such, it violates the 6th Commandment.

Dear Padre,

Are people born with the Holy Spirit, or do they have to be baptized in order to receive the Holy Spirit? If we are not born with the Holy Spirit, is it just our conscience that is bothered when we are doing wrong?

Your question is suggesting that the Holy Spirit is "in" or "out." St. Paul teaches us, "In him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28). In other words, the Spirit of God is always with us, and we are dependent on that Spirit for life. There is no beginning and there is no end; the Spirit always was, and is, and will be.



The *Catechism of the Catholic* Church explains that "Conscience is a judgment of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed. In all he says and does, man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right" (1778). We have an obligation to form our consciences to know what is right and to help our children form theirs. It is with the cooperation of the Spirit that a "good conscience" is formed.

When we celebrate the sacraments, including the sacrament of baptism, we are confirming the life of the Spirit that is within is. We are acknowledging and proclaiming the abiding presence of the Spirit of God. •
