

Our Lady of the Desert

As we saw last week, the catechism begins its treatment of the 6th commandment by looking at the virtue of chastity. Next, it turns to ways that people sin against chastity.

The first treated offense is lust. The catechism defines lust as the "disordered desire for or inordinate enjoyment of sexual pleasure." (CCC #2351) This paragraph continues by saying that sin occurs whenever we allow ourselves to seek sexual pleasure as an end in itself. Sexual pleasure should always be sought not only for pleasure, but also for its unitive and procreative ends. Therefore, sex should only occur within a marriage relationship.

Next, the catechism speaks of masturbation. The catechism declares that, "Both the magisterium of the Church, in the course of a constant tradition, and the moral sense of the faithful have been in no doubt and have firmly maintained that masturbation is an intrinsically and gravely disordered action." (CCC # 2352) Again, sexual actions should only occur within a marriage relationship. This alone honors the meaning of sex, which should always be caught up in mutual self-giving and procreation. The catechism also admits that masturbation frequently flows from immaturity, force of habit, anxiety, or other psychological or social factors. These things can limit the culpability of the sin because of the lack of knowledge or freedom that they bring with them. (See CCC #2352)

A Prayer to St. Joseph, Defender of Life







Dear Padre,

Is envy a sin? I find myself becoming very envious of people who have more than I do. I find it difficult to be content with what my family and I have now.

We live in a climate that encourages discontent with what we have. Advertising plays on our feelings of envy and our desire for possessions. In this almost universal rush to possess more and better material objects, Christians are called to a counterwitness. We are called to embrace a freedom and a poverty of spirit that actually rejoices in the blessings of others.



The Tenth Commandment alerts us to the danger of undisciplined envy: "You shall not covet...anything that belongs to your neighbor" (Exodus 20:17). In the New Testament, Jesus says that where our treasure is, there also will be our heart. (See Matthew 6:21.) The real antidote to envy, then, is prayers of thanks for all God has given to us and others. To feel envious, to desire or covet someone else's possessions, is not in itself a mortal sin. But to let that feeling invade your mind, to indulge it and rationalize it, is to let that feeling harden into an envious frame of mind. Then you are flirting with real sin. The grave sin is to allow these envious thoughts to drive you to any injustice or evil. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* sums it up well: "Would you like to see God glorified by you? Then rejoice in your brother's [and sister's] progress, and you will immediately give glory to God" (2540). •
